The Battle of Lepanto

In the 1560s, the Ottomans began their assault on the Christian Mediterranean and quickly conquered most of the eastern islands. If their powerful forces invaded Venice and Rome, the result would have been the end of Christian Europe. Pope St. Pius V saw the impending danger and called on the leaders of the West to unite but the request was denied. Queen Elizabeth in England was too preoccupied with her rivalry with Spain, France was an ally of the Turks and Phillip II of Spain was busy with his expansion into the New World. However Phillip II did agree to send his 24-year-old half brother, Don Juan of Austria, and dozens of ships. With volunteers from Mediterranean countries, Don Juan was able to gather together a fleet of about 208 ships-about 80 fewer than the Turkish fleet. The pope had used all of his influence to get the Christian states of Spain, Naples, Sicily, Venice, Genoa, Sardinia, Savoy, Urbino, Papal States, Germans, and Croatians to assemble under Don Juan to form the Holy League. Phillip II made one more significant donation, the first copy of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Remarkably, the picture had been touched to the original image on Juan Diego's cloak. It was kept in the stateroom of the Genovese admiral as the standard for the Christian fleet. *(Image hangs today in Aveto, near Genoa.)* The pope was also seeking the Blessed Mother's aid so when the ships set out from Messina on September 16, 1571, he made sure that all the men onboard had rosaries.

Under the command of Lala Kara Mustafa Pasha, the Ottoman warriors had already proven strong and ruthless. When they surrounded the Christians in Cyprus and demands were not met, they flayed alive Venetian commander, Marco Antonio Bragadin, and ordered the execution of all 6,000 Christians prisoners. The beautiful St. Nicholas Church was converted into the Lala Mustafa Pasha Mosque.

On October 7, 1571, the largest and most decisive sea battle on the Mediterranean took place off the western coast of Greece. Known as the Battle of Lepanto, the Holy League battled Ali Pasha's fleet of 251 ships, 82,000 crew and thousands of Christian galley slaves who were rowing under the decks. St. Pope Pius V had called upon all of Europe to pray the Rosary for victory. Christians gathered in villages and towns to pray as the sea battle raged; and at the hour of victory the pope—who was hundreds of miles away at the Vatican—is said to have gotten up from a meeting, walked over to an open window exclaiming, *"This is not a moment for business; make haste to thank God, because our fleet this moment has won a victory over the Turks."* When the official news from the fleet reached Europe, the pope gave credit to the Virgin Mary by declaring October 7th Her feast day. Lepanto would be the last major battle with rowing vessels. See <u>"Battle of Lepanto"</u> for further details.
