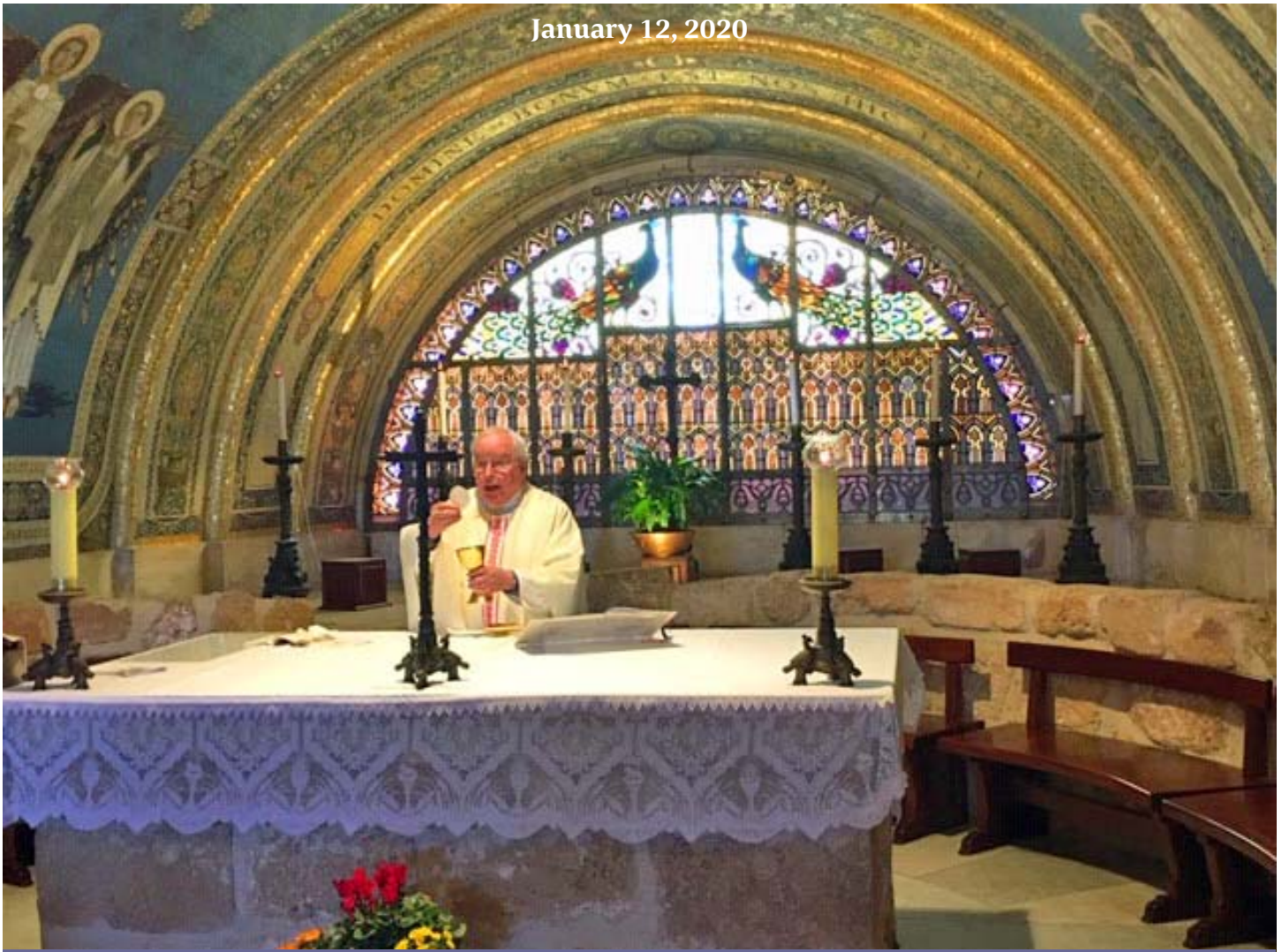

Baby Moses: A new king who was called Pharaoh came into power in Egypt. 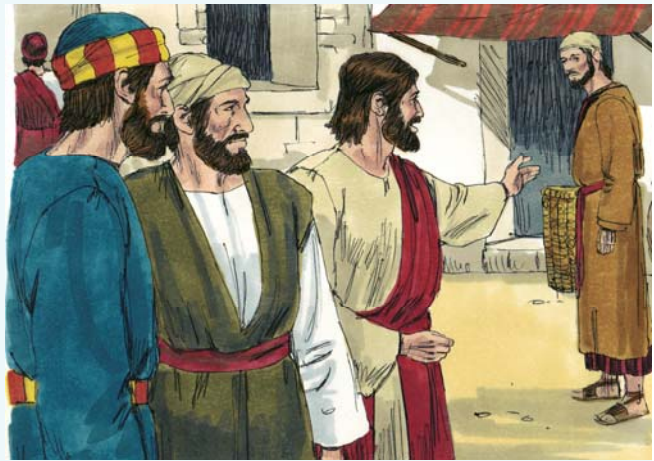

Peter Walks on Water: If you've ever tried walking on the ocean, you know it's impossible. So when the disciples were in a boat without Jesus, suddenly one of them said, "What is that!" He pointed out into the water and all the disciples turned around to see what was out there. "I think it's a ghost, what else could it be!" Jesus shook His head and called out, "It's alright. I am here, do not be afraid." Then Peter replied, "Lord, if it's really you, tell me to come to you on the water."

Disciples Selected by Jesus: Jesus walked by many boats but stopped and watched some men at a particular boat. These men were Simon (whose nickname was Peter) and his brother Andrew. They were working very hard and were frustrated about not catching any fish the night before. They had actually met Jesus before, but only for a short time. John the Baptist had introduced them to Jesus, just after Jesus was baptized. Jesus went right up to their boat and asked them if they could put their boat out into the water again. He then climbed in and sat down.

Pentecost: God didn't just pick any day for this to happen. Like everything God does, He has a specific time, purpose and reason for it. Pentecost occurred 50 days after Easter Sunday or 50 days after Jesus rose from the dead. Just before Jesus ascended into heaven He told them that they would receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon them. Even more, he told them much earlier that the counselor (or Holy Spirit) would be sent by the Father, and that He would teach them all things.

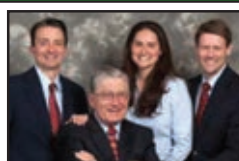
