The Month March was named after the very first Roman month, Maritus, which was named after Mars, the god of war. Lent has already begun and our Church teaches us to reflect and prepare for the feast of Easter. Lent mirrors Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal in the desert for 40 days. St. Joseph pray for our families, please.

For religious freedom all over the world, for our family members fallen away from the church, for our divided country and for a world in dire need to return to the ways of God. 
