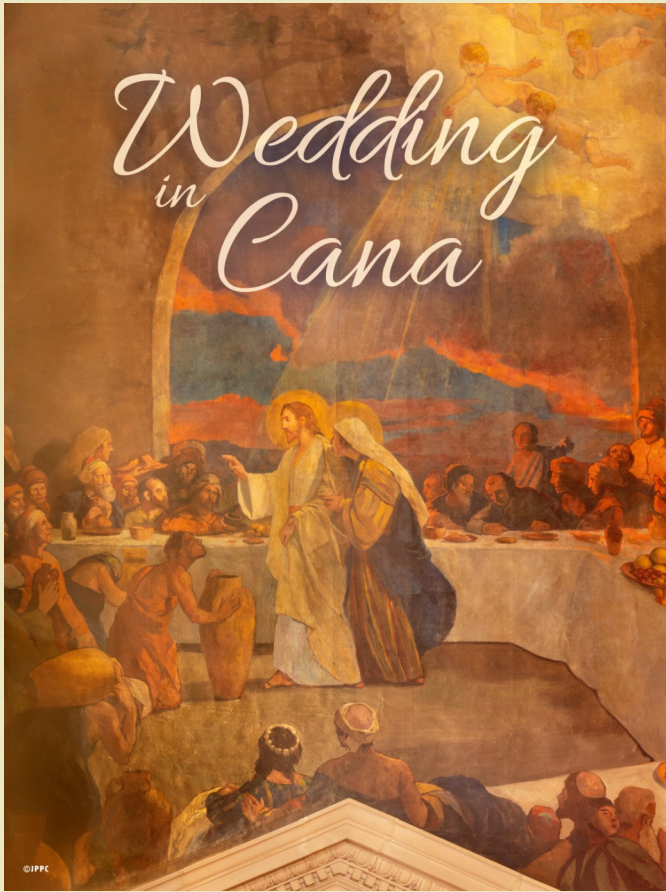

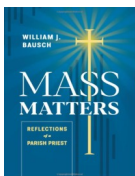

Eucharistic Devotion

The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

CYO News

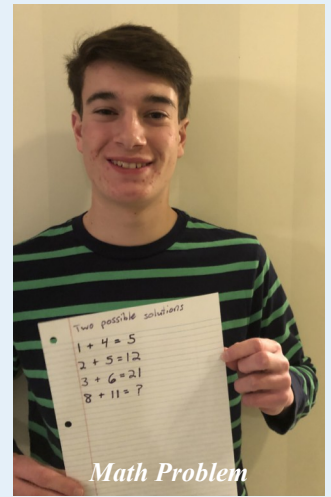
Many thanks to our CYO members who participated in our January 9th ZOOM meeting hosted by Caitlin and Frannie!

Math Problem

Caitlin and Frannie read from the Book of Jonah and gave an excellent commentary on it. We learned that God has no problem calling people out of their comfort zone and that you cannot run away from Him. He will keep calling you to do His will; and once we give our ok, we will see miraculous things happen in our lives. The Book of Jonah also emphasizes God's will to forgive people and give them a second chance if they are willing to truly repent and change their ways.

Katie read and commented on Romans 14: 1-12 and the importance of being patient with others who have a different opinion from ours and that we should never pass judgment on others.

"Do Not Judge Another" **Romans chapter 14: Verses 1-12**

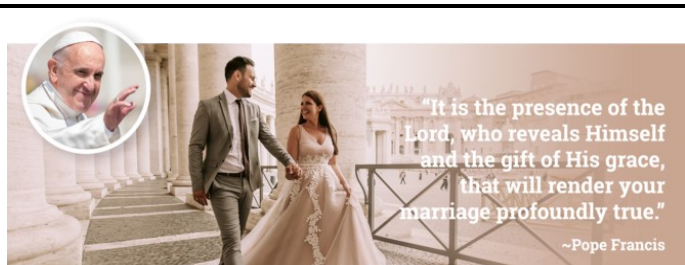
