

World Mission Sunday 2024



"GO AND INVITE EVERYONE TO THE BANQUET"

The Old Testament and Gospel readings this weekend encourage us to be optimistic and confident. In them we witness how God acts when people ask for something important to them. He responds and gives them what they need!

Consider this: Jeremiah, a prophet who often comes across as sad and dark, proclaims to his hearers in the passage we just heard words of joyful reassurance and optimism.

Jeremiah's message today is one of brightness. He reassures the people who have been in brutal exile that they will come home because God has said so. This message is full of light and faith.

In the Gospel, with similar optimism but focused not on an entire nation but only a single person, Jesus does something for Bartimaeus. Bartimaeus asks Jesus for sight. Jesus quickly and completely responds by giving it to him. In this case the light surrounding the action is not just the illumination of optimistic hope, like in Jeremiah, but it is the real, true light of bodily sight.

So, we witness how decisively God responds to those who are in need.

But this applies not just to the Exiles and to Bartimaeus. It also applies to us. We want God to do things: to heal us, to forgive us, to strengthen us, to include us.

At times it may seem God responds. At other times, it may feel that he does n When we think God does not respond it may be particularly difficult to bear b that perceived divine silence is inconsistent with what we know of God. Why would God want someone to be blind? Why would he want a people to be in exile? Well, he gave sight to Bartimaeus and he brought back the people in exile so why can he not grant what we ask of him as well?






