Last Sunday's CYO meeting turned out to be one of the most enjoyable and enlightening one's ever!

Our teen angels arrived with lots of Thanksgiving food for the poor, then they had a soccer game competition between the girls and the boys. You go, girls—although both teams were amazing!

The highlight of the night was having Deacon Joe Stillo with us—indubitably one of St. Mark's most shining treasures!!!!! He led us in prayer with an inspiring reflection on how we can live lives of faith by serving the poor and forgiving others. He then took us upstairs and went through the various parts of the Catholic Mass explaining to us what each part meant. We especially loved when he talked about the Kiss of Peace—how it was not meant to be a mere wave to your fellow parishioners but instead to greet all present with heartfelt love, kindness, compassion and forgiveness. All night long Deacon Joe emphasized the importance of loving God and neighbor and that to find true happiness we had to not think of money and how to satisfy earthly desires—but instead to love and serve God and others the way that Jesus taught us. He told us he learned that humility in admitting our own failures in life can also be a great teacher.

What a truly loving witness he gave us and even took time to answer some physician questions on how to live a healthy life and what to do if a young person is at a party and sees a friend there that may be suffering from alcohol poisoning or a drug overdose. Doctor Joe said—"you don't hesitate--you call 911 and then you call your friend's parents."

Deacon Joe also talked about the work of a deacon and his own calling to become one. He mentioned St. Stephen—the first deacon and martyr! Anyone who has ever felt called by God to do anything knows what "God's calling us" feels like—I loved the expression of awe and joy he had on his face when he talked about that moment he knew God was calling him!!!!

I remember driving home last Sunday and thinking—Wow--he would be an awesome youth minister!! He was so kind and great with all of our CYO angels! Thank you, Deacon Joe—and thank you, Dr. Joe!!!!
