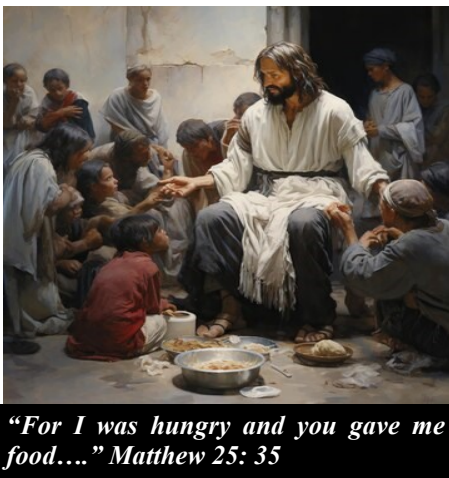

Some Thoughts for November by Marge Loenser

We start November with the great Feast of All Saints. The first reading from this mass is from Revelation: "I (John) had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice:

"Salvation comes from God who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb." When we think about all the saints in heaven (having limited thinking as a human) we wonder how they can all fit in heaven; remember we're not just talking about canonized saints, but every soul admitted in to heaven has to be a saint. You know, I do believe I will leave that little problem to God along with all the other puzzling questions my mind conjures up.

November 2nd is the Feast of All Souls. A time to remember and pray for our family members and friends that have gone on before us. I understand that the Holy Souls cannot pray for themselves, but they can pray for us. Sounds like the making of very healthy interrelationships.

On the 4th, we celebrate St. Charles Borromeo, Archbishop of Milan from the 1500's. He was a leading figure along with St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Philip Neri against the Protestant Reformation.

November 5th is election day. If we haven't already voted we have a responsibility to choose leaders who will best follow God's inspiration and our constitution in carrying out their duties.

On the 11th we remember St. Martin of Tours. He was the saint who tore his cloak in two and shared it with a beggar; later on in a vision, the beggar turned out to be Jesus, Himself. I love that story.

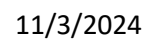

St. Mark's Social Concerns Ministry is resuming the Frozen Meals Program for the Center in Asbury Park which was discontinued due to the Covid pandemic. The Center in Asbury Park, Inc., is a volunteer-based New Jersey not-for-profit service organization, providing support services for people living with HIV/AIDS and their caregivers since 1992.

The process is simple! Here's what to do:

- Pick up food trays and lids next to the kitchen refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall (St. Mark's Church basement)
- Fill the trays with generous portions of food
- Label the tray lids with the contents and date of preparation
- Return the meals to the freezer compartment of the refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall.

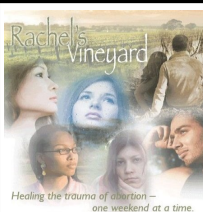

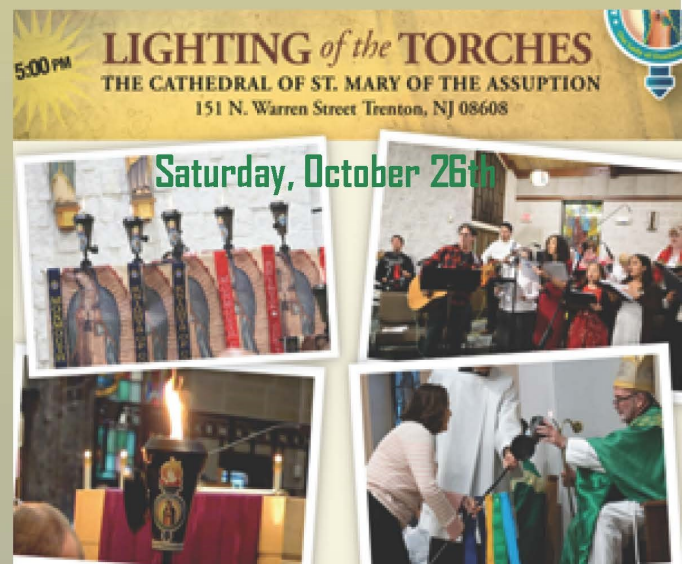
