

Some Thoughts for December, 2024 by Marge Loenser


Yeah, It's December! It's got to be our favorite month of the year because December lights up our brain with thoughts of "CHRISTMAS." But let's not get ahead of ourselves because it also means Advent, and Advent begins December 1st. Advent, from the Latin word "Adventus" means "arrival," or "coming." I know Santa Claus is "coming" to town, but "Santa" is small potatoes compared to the "coming" of Baby Jesus. And when we think of Baby Jesus we think of His beautiful Mother Mary, whose Immaculate Conception we celebrate on December 8th. What that simply means is that at the very moment of Her conception in the womb of St. Anne, Almighty God gave her the privilege of being born free of original sin. - Return the meals to the freezer compartment of the refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall.
