




St. Mark's Social Concerns Knitters





Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

A common plot line in theatrical works is that of mistaken identity. The piece could be a farce involving twins who switch roles. Or a serious drama involving the murder of the wrong victim. We the reader or the theater patron either laugh at the first or are shocked by the mistake in the second example.

When Our Lord walked this earth, gracing our planet in ways far beyond a simple tally of them, He had to struggle against a case of mistaken identity held by His fellow Jewish countrymen. It all involved the popular conceptions about the coming Messiah and Our Lord's take on the matter. Over time, the Jews made the Messiah out to be the superhero military leader who would rout the hated Romans. With His invincible army and his blood-stained sword, riding upon a stout steed he would assume a throne of glory and judge the nations.

There was no room here for a gentle Shepherd. Much less an itinerant preacher bred by poverty and hailing from a sleepy hamlet named Nazareth, that was far too insignificant to claim a place on any developed map. Moreover, Jesus' message proved contradictory. On the one hand, it was too startling and demanding for many among the crowds He initially attracted, especially among the Scribes and Pharisees. On the other hand, many found His message hope-filled and promising.

Jesus' precursor was His own cousin, John the Baptist, a rough desert dweller whose volatile style also attracted many followers. But the Baptist got himself jailed because he was not afraid to speak truth to power. The people grew confused when their champion directed them to Jesus. To end the confusion, John sent a delegation to ask Jesus about His credentials.

True to form, Jesus answers the group's question indirectly, challenging their powers of deduction. He pointed out healings of the afflicted that were prophesied about the Redeemer. As the group headed back to the imprisoned John with their report, Jesus raised His voice with a tribute to the Baptist any one of us would like to hear directed our way.

Advent has a penitential aspect about it, less pungent than the penance asked for in Lent, but still penitential. We recall and repent of our sins in preparation for the grand Feast of Christmas. We acknowledge that we have fallen into a state of mistaken identity, choosing all sorts of substitutes for happiness instead of the things of God. Advent urges us to take a trip to the confessional before the big day.

Meanwhile, mistaken identity can make us forget what Christmas is all about. A recent poll conducted by the Lutheran Church found that the largest percentage of Christians interviewed said that Christmas was all about families getting together. A nice response, but what happened to Christmas being about Jesus?







En aquel tiempo, Juan se encontraba en la cárcel, y habiendo oído hablar de las obras de Cristo, le mandó preguntar por medio de dos discípulos: "¿Eres tú el que ha de venir o tenemos que esperar a otro?" Jesús les respondió: "Vayan a contar a Juan lo que están viendo y oyendo: los ciegos ven, los cojos andan, los leprosos quedan limpios de la lepra, los sordos oyen, los muertos resucitan y a los pobres se les anuncia el Evangelio. Dichoso aquel que no se sienta defraudado por mí". Cuando se fueron los discípulos, Jesús se puso a hablar a la gente acerca de Juan: "¿Qué fueron ustedes a ver en el desierto? ¿Una caña sacudida por el viento? No. Pues entonces, ¿qué fueron a ver? ¿A un hombre lujosamente vestido? No, ya que los que visten con lujo habitan en los palacios. ¿A qué fueron, pues? ¿A ver a un profeta? Sí, yo se lo aseguro; y a uno que es todavía más que profeta. Porque de él está escrito: He aquí que yo envío a mi mensajero para que vaya delante de ti y te prepare el camino. Yo les aseguro que no ha surgido entre los hijos de una mujer ninguno más grande que Juan el Bautista. Sin embargo, el más pequeño en el Reino de los cielos, es todavía más grande que él".
