Question: What is the greatest gift you will give this Christmas...and how well do you think it will be received?

The more I ponder this question, first personally as a wife, mother and grandmother, and then as a youth minster, I kind of am stuck in the present

moment because of where I was today with the CYO. Since 1999 it's been a joy being there with the CYO each year as they go Christmas caroling in various senior care facilities in our area. From 2020-2022 we

were no longer able to do this—due to covid—what else? This year we were invited back. And what an invitation it was!!!!!!!!!

The first room in which the CYO sang looked like a recreation room (our CYO over the years have led exercise classes there so I immediately recognized it.) There were only about half a dozen or more of the elderly residents in that room when we arrived. All looked anxious to hear the kids sing.

The CYO angels did not disappoint. They sang Deck the Hall. Jingle Bells, Silent Night, Joy to the World, Silver Bells and many other Christmas favorites. I could see in the faces of the residents how much they enjoyed every single carol.

Then we went to private rooms to sing to various people there. The joy on their faces was indescribable. I realized that for them this was the greatest of all: young people visiting the old —and often forgotten. Perhaps these beautiful people wait every day for visitors that often do not come. Maybe they long for the lives that they had in their youth but of course those days will never come again either. What did come to see them were a few beautiful teenage youth who gifted them with their time, talent and their treasure, and above all these with their love.

(Did I mention that the staff was gleaming too and singing along with us as we went caroling down every hallway!!!!!!!!!)

I can't imagine how the Holy Family of Bethlehem felt when in their isolated and often lonesome surroundings they were suddenly visited by gentle shepherds and then later the magnificent Magi—who gifted them with gold, frankincense and myrrh. The CYO gifts of gold to the elderly were their presence, their frankincense the songs they sang, and their myrrh the beautiful homemade Christmas cards they gave to the residents.

Yes, I think this may have been the best Christmas gift given to our elderly friends who were visited by an angelic choir on Dec. 17. It was definitely the best Christmas gift I received this year.


