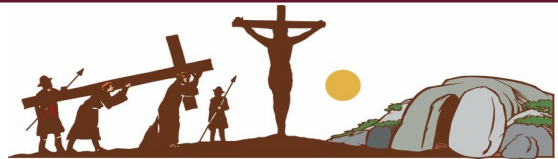

Last Sunday at the beginning of our meeting we walked the Stations of the Cross in the upstairs' church. Each CYO member had a chance to lead a Station in meditation and prayer. After each Station, we talked about what it teaches us about our own lives and what we are called to do as Christians. Throughout salvation history we have seen so many innocents falsely condemned and martyred for the faith. Herod ordered the slaughter of innocent baby boys! Stephen was stoned to death, John the Baptist (the lone voice crying in the wilderness), ten apostles were martyred, and thousands more! The CYO talked about those unjustly put to death today—those hated because of their faith, color, ethnicity, and our precious unborn children. We also talked about how we can be like Simon—helping the afflicted and falsely condemned to carry their crosses, or like Veronica—having the courage to reach out and comfort those suffering pain, sorrow, rejection and complete abandonment. After we finished the Way of the Cross, we read a reflection on the Resurrection of Jesus. Suddenly we could all smile again!
