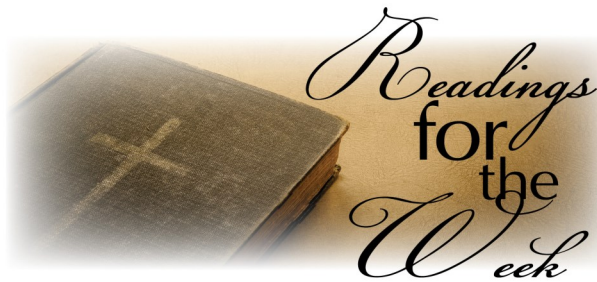

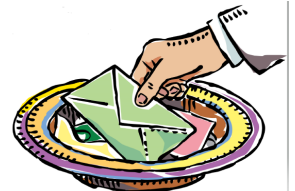
St. Mark's Bereavement Ministry

They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them.

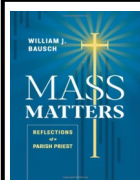
They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

Some Thoughts for February 2022 by Marge Loenser



The name February comes from the Roman “Februa” which was their feast of purification. We start this February with the Feast of the Presentation of our Lord. You grandparents have got to envy Simeon and Anna at the Presentation. How they doted on baby Jesus. Imagine holding God as a baby in your arms! February 2 is also my youngest daughter, Celeste’s birthday. I often say she is triply blessed as --the Presentation, Candlemass Day, and Ground Hog day all decorate the anniversary of her birth.

On the 3rd we celebrate St. Blaise, the patron saint of throat diseases. His remains are in a church named after him in Croatia. In the year 917 the spirit of St. Blaise visited the church in Dubrovnik and told the people that there were fleets of Venetian warriors anchored off the harbor of the Aegean getting ready to attack the city. His warning saved the city and he became their patron saint. St. Blaise was martyred in the 4th century by beheading.



Another saint we honor this month is St. Agatha. She was murdered for refusing to marry a Roman nobleman as she had pledged her virginity to the Lord. St. Agatha is the patron saint of breast feeding and breast cancer.

We honor Our lady of Lourdes on the 11th. Healing miracles are still occurring from the holy water that sprung from the ground when St. Bernadette, at Mary’s bidding started digging in the dirt. Our Lady had a basilica built there and today thousands of pilgrims visit the springs for healing.



Of course we cant help but think of Valentine’s day when we think of February. There were 3 martyred priests by that name in the 3rd century. One of them would marry young Roman soldiers that were forbidden to wed by emperor Claudius. He was imprisoned for this, and when he healed a young blind woman, was released and started to evangelize this pagan household. For this he was imprisoned again . In prison he exchanged letters with the young woman he had healed . His last letter to her before he was killed was signed from “Your Valentine.” Thus began the tradition.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ let us never cease to be thankful for all the wonderful saints that came before us. They gave their lives for Jesus. Let us be thankful for all the blessings we have each day. Despite these very trying times let us not be discouraged, but let us keep Jesus in the forefront of our daily life. We are being tested and we need to continue to be good Christian examples to this corrupted society. Don’t ever forget that in the end, Jesus will conquer, and that this earth is only our temporary dwelling--heaven is our real home. God bless us each one.

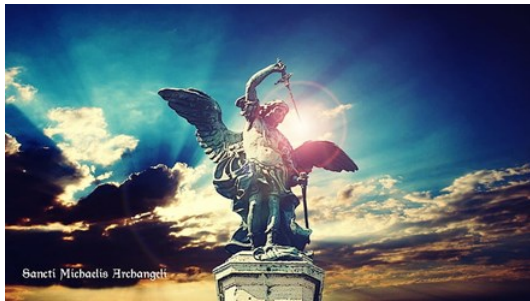

CYO News

St. Michael the Archangel is the patron saint of our police officers, paramedics and the military. After listening to Officer Bill Ostrosky of the Wilmington PD at our ZOOM meeting last weekend, we further understand the true calling to all of these courageous men and women: to protect all of us from the dangers and evil in the world.

Kyle our ZOOM host wrote...

“Officer Ostrosky is a great Catholic police officer. He grew up in NY, going to Catholic schools for 12 years. He got his Bachelor’s from York College of Pa. where my brother is currently a junior. He started at the NYPD in 1993 but then moved to NC in 1998, joining the Wilmington Police Dept. Currently, Officer Ostrosky is working patrol there. Overall, he is a great officer and a better man. He goes to Mass every Sunday with his family and he strives every day to protect others.”

Thomas wrote...

“At tonight’s meeting I learned that the best thing to do if you see someone overdose on drugs at a party or other place in public is to call 911 immediately because it could mean the difference between life and death for them.”

Caitlin...

“The first thing that I learned from the meeting with Officer Ostrosky was why there have been so many attacks on police lately. He said it is because deaths are advertised way more than they should be today. They are advertised in things that everyone has access to including video games, tv shows, and movies. Another thing I learned is that drugs are everywhere today and especially in our lives as teenagers. They are cheap, easily accessible, and manufactured to get you addicted quickly. It’s important not to get involved with them and to make sure your friends don’t either. I learned that if you are at a party or with someone who has overdosed, that the best thing to do is call 911. The meeting was very informative.”

Officer Ostrosky believes that his Catholic faith helps him a lot as a police officer. He explained that he brings kindness and calm into every situation and that often helps to relieve tension or further violence in a crime situation. He tries to advocate for and be fair to all parties. He explained that the recent increase in violence against the police is just representative of increased violence in general and crime increasing...mostly due to the violence in electronic media. People have become desensitized to violence, and the police are always the first line of defense; so the violence against them always gets noticed first. He encouraged everyone to practice their faith, treat others with kindness, and stay close to Jesus. He really believes that God called him to be a police officer and he has felt very fulfilled in his work. He and his wife have six children and love their Catholic faith.
