

# St. Mark's hosts Caritas Chamber Chorale in *Grace for the Wayfarer*For the benefit of the Adorno Fathers' African Mission

<u>A Feast for Your Ears</u> Caritas Chamber Chorale, a group of 20+ well tuned voices singing *a cappella*, will be at St. Mark's Church **Saturday evening**, **April 5th** to perform an impressive Lenten concert titled: *Grace for the Wayfarer*.

The performance starts at 7:30 PM.

The concert's theme is best described by Caritas Director Barbara Sanderman.

She savs:

Taking the theme of this Jubilee Year 2025 (Pilgrims of Hope) as its starting point, Grace for the Wayfarer is a musical study of the many moments and places in our lives where grace is abundantly available to us. We let our music Program's inspire us to become aware of the unmerited favor of God. May you encounter that grace.

The program is an eclectic mix of song. Some hymns contemporary, some ancient. They range from rousing Spirituals to American folk songs, from sacred traditional to one in language of old Orthodox Liturgy (Slavonic). There's even a brief motet written for a queen's coronation. But they all convey, in one form or another, God's unceasing love and endless grace available to us simply for the asking.

Here are a few examples.

<u>Hope Waits</u> Written during the Covid-19 pandemic, the composer tells us, "even as we encounter sadness and pain, hope stands waiting for us to choose it".

<u>Over My Head</u> With this rousing Spiritual, we thank God for music, and find grace and joy in our song.

<u>Of Hospitality</u> The text comes from an old Gaelic rune in both text & song, the simple kindness of hospitality expands to generous blessing and a mystical encounter with love.


<u>As Though of God</u> Caritas Composer in Residence Wayne Dietterick creatively set to music this Sonnet, written by musician & poet Mark Boyle and presented to Caritas, based on its Mission of serving the poorest of the poor through the art of sacred music. This 2025 performance is the premiere of *As Though of God*.

#### Some Thoughts for March 2025 by Marge Loenser

March is here! Hooray! That means longer daylight, sprouting bulbs, signs of spring...thank God! Its been a brutal winter and we are ready for a nice spring thaw. When its not blowing too hard we can even plan on going for a walk. (Lord, don't I sound like a senior)

Lent begins on March 5th, Ash Wednesday. Some ashes on the forehead remind us how temporary our life is here and that we must shake off our complacency and seek closeness with God by sacrifice and a deeper prayer life. Getting back to reading scripture each day is very rewarding in many ways.





He spent six years there working as a herdsman during which time he fervently turned to his faith as a Christian. He escaped to Britain and was, after another brief captivity, reunited with his parents. After a time he returned to Ireland where he journeyed far and wide converting the pagans. Thank you St. Patrick for bringing Christianity to Ireland! St. Patrick pray for us.

We celebrate dear St. Joseph on the 19th. Faithful spouse of Mary and foster father and mentor to Jesus. St. Joseph was a craftsman. We think of St. Joseph as a carpenter, but since they lived in a mountainous region, they probably not only worked in wood, but as stone masons as well. Living in Nazareth, They were only a couple of miles from Sepphoris, so its logical that St. Joseph and Jesus, as a young man and apprentice, would have traveled there to work. St. Joseph is the patron saint of fathers, families, workers, and of course he is protector of the church. St. Joseph pray for us.

So let us delve into Lent with good intensions and steadfast prayers. Remember fasting does not only apply to food, but from complacency and the three "C"s or cancers of spirituality, being complaint, control, and criticism. God bless us, each one.

## Guidelines for making the most of Lenten season

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead — from Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, until Holy Thursday morning, April 17, 2025 — the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these 40 days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert — alone, fasting and in intense prayer — beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those 40 days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reasonof sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

- 2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.
- 3. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as noted above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.
- 4. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.
- 5. The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year often called "Easter duty" for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, March 9 2025, to Trinity Sunday, June 15, 2025.

However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to Confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church. We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of Penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.




