Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion Lectionary: 37 and 38 At the Procession with Palms - Gospel Lk 19:28-40

Jesus proceeded on his journey up to Jerusalem. As he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples. He said, "Go into the village opposite you, and as you enter it you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. And if anyone should ask you, 'Why are you untying it?' you will answer, 'The Master has need of it."" So those who had been sent went off and found everything just as he had told them. And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying this colt?" They answered, "The Master has need of it." So they brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks over the colt, and helped Jesus to mount. As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road; and now as he was approaching the slope of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of his disciples began to praise God aloud with joy for all the mighty deeds they had seen. They proclaimed: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest." Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." He said in reply, "I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out!" I have conducted my investigation in your presence and have not found this man guilty of the charges you have brought against him, nor did Herod, for he sent him back to us. So no capital crime has been committed by him. Therefore I shall have him flogged and then release him." But all together they shouted out, "Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us." - Now Barabbas had been imprisoned for a rebellion that had taken place in the city and for murder. — Again Pilate addressed them, still wishing to release Jesus, but they continued their shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate addressed them a third time, "What evil has this man done? I found him guilty of no capital crime. Therefore I shall have him flogged and then release him." With loud shouts, however, they persisted in calling for his crucifixion, and their voices prevailed. The verdict of Pilate was that their demand should be granted. So he released the man who had been imprisoned for rebellion and murder, for whom they asked, and he handed Jesus over to them to deal with as they

wished.

As they led him away

they took hold of a certain Simon, a Cyrenian, who was coming in from the country; and after laying the cross on him, they made him carry it behind Jesus. A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him. Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children for indeed, the days are coming when people will say, 'Blessed are the barren. the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed.' At that time people will say to the mountains, 'Fall upon us!' and to the hills, 'Cover us!' for if these things are done when the wood is green what will happen when it is dry?" Now two others, both criminals, were led away with him to be executed. When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him and the criminals there, one on his right, the other on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." They divided his garments by casting lots. The people stood by and watched; the rulers, meanwhile, sneered at him and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read,

Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us.' The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." It was now about noon and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon because of an eclipse of the sun. Then the veil of the temple was torn down the middle. Jesus cried out in a loud voice,

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit"; and when he had said this he breathed his last.

Here all kneel and pause for a short time.

The centurion who witnessed what had happened glorified

[&]quot;This is the King of the Jews."

God and said, "This man was innocent beyond doubt." It was the day of preparation, and the sabbath was about to begin. The women who had come from Galilee with him followed behind. and when they had seen the tomb and the way in which his body was laid in it, they returned and prepared spices and perfumed oils. 



The Triduum

Throughout the Triduum, the three greatest days and nights in the Church's liturgical year, beginning with the Mass of the Lord's Supper and not concluding until Easter, we profess our belief in the Nicene Creed, joining that chorus of voices that tradition holds that Pilate's wife may have heard in a dream on Good Friday in Jerusalem.

Holy Thursday

Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:30 PM (bilingual.)

Leave the Church in sacred silence or stay for Eucharistic Adoration until 10 PM.

Good Friday

Passion of the Lord at 3 PM with Communion and Veneration of the Cross. Again, leave the Church in sacred silence.

Passion of the Lord at 5 PM (Spanish) with Communion and Veneration of the Cross

CYO presents Stations of the Cross live at 7:30 PM (bilingual). Veneration of the Cross follows.

Holy Saturday

Blessing of the Easter Food at 1 PM. Easter Vigil at 8 PM (bilingual). There is no 4:30 PM Mass.

Easter Sunday

Masses at 8 AM, 10 AM, 12 Noon. Spanish Mass at 2 PM. There is no 5 PM Mass.

Sunday of Divine Mercy, April 24

Holy Hour with recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet will begin at 2 PM.

Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

Like the prophets before him, the Suffering Servant is ignored and badly treated. Having a "face like flint" is a very effective description here because it includes the defacing spittle upon it.

Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

This ancient hymn Paul uses to exhort selflessness among the believers in the place. The hymn has its special beauty and emotional tug.

The Gospel of the Passion: Luke 22: 14 – 23: 56

Opening with the institution of the Eucharist, Luke's Passion account includes details galore, but above all the rejection of Jesus by the people in His crucifixion. The story ends with a kingly kind of burial.





Abril 10, 2022 Domingo de Ramos "De la pasión del Señor"

Procesión de las Palmas - Evangelio: Lc 19, 28-40.

En aquel tiempo, Jesús, acompañado de sus discípulos, iba camino de Jerusalén, y al acercarse a Betfagé y a Betania, junto al monte llamado de los Olivos, envió a dos de sus discípulos, diciéndoles: "Vayan al caserío que está frente a ustedes. Al entrar, encontrarán atado un burrito que nadie ha montado todavía. Desátenlo y tráiganlo aquí. Ŝi alguien les pregunta por qué lo desatan, díganle: 'El Señor lo necesita' ". Fueron y encontraron todo como el Señor les había dicho. Mientras desataban el burro, los dueños les preguntaron: "¿Por qué lo desamarran?" Ellos contestaron: "El Señor lo necesita". Se llevaron, pues, el burro, le echaron encima los mantos e hicieron que Jesús montara en él. Conforme iba avanzando, la gente tapizaba el camino con sus mantos, y cuando ya estaba cerca la bajada del monte de los Olivos, la multitud de discípulos, entusiasmados, se pusieron a alabar a Dios a gritos por todos los prodigios que habían visto, diciendo: "¡Bendito el rey que viene en nombre del Señor! ¡Paz en el cielo y gloria en las alturas!" Algunos fariseos que iban entre la gente, le dijeron: "Maestro, reprende a tus discípulos". Él les replicó: "Les aseguro que si ellos se callan, gritarán las piedras".

Primera Lectura: Is 50, 4-7.

Evangelio: Lc 22, 14-23, 56.

Llegada la hora de cenar, se sentó Jesús con sus discípulos y les dijo: "Cuánto he deseado celebrar esta Pascua con ustedes, antes de padecer, porque yo les aseguro que ya no la volveré a celebrar, hasta que tenga cabal cumplimiento en el Reino de Dios". Luego tomó en sus manos una copa de vino, pronunció la acción de gracias y dijo: "Tomen esto y repártanlo entre ustedes, porque les aseguro que ya no volveré a beber del fruto de la vid hasta que venga el Reino de Dios". Tomando después un pan, pronunció la acción de gracias, lo partió y se lo dio, diciendo: "Esto es mi cuerpo, que se entrega por ustedes. Hagan esto en memoria mía". Después de cenar, hizo lo mismo con una copa de vino, diciendo: "Esta copa es la nueva alianza, sellada con mi sangre, que se derrama por ustedes". "Pero miren: la mano del que me va a entregar está conmigo en la mesa. Porque el Hijo del hombre va a morir, según lo decretado; pero jay de aquel hombre por quien será entregado!" Ellos empezaron a preguntarse unos a otros quién de ellos podía ser el que lo iba a traicionar. Después los discípulos se pusieron a discutir sobre cuál de ellos debería ser considerado como el más importante. Jesús les dijo: "Los reyes de los paganos los dominan, y los que ejercen la autoridad se hacen llamar bienhechores. Pero ustedes no hagan eso, sino todo lo contrario: que el mayor entre ustedes actúe como si fuera el menor, y el que gobierna, como si fuera un servidor. Porque, ¿quién vale más, el que está a la mesa o el que sirve? ¿Verdad que es el que está a la mesa? Pues yo estoy en medio de ustedes como el que sirve. Ustedes han perseverado conmigo en mis pruebas, y yo les voy a dar el Reino, como mi

Padre me lo dio a mí, para que coman y beban a mi mesa en el Reino, y se siente cada uno en un trono, para juzgar a las doce tribus de Israel". Luego añadió: "Simón, Simón, mira que Satanás ha pedido permiso para zarandearlos como trigo; pero yo he orado por ti, para que tu fe no desfallezca; y tú, una vez convertido, confirma a tus hermanos". Él le contestó: "Señor, estoy dispuesto a ir contigo incluso a la cárcel y a la muerte". Jesús le replicó: "Te digo, Pedro, que hoy, antes de que cante el gallo, habrás negado tres veces que me conoces". Después les dijo a todos ellos: "Cuando los envié sin provisiones, sin dinero ni sandalias, ¿acaso les faltó algo?" Ellos contestaron: "Nada". Él añadió: "Ahora, en cambio, el que tenga dinero o provisiones, que los tome; y el que no tenga espada, que venda su manto y compre una. Les aseguro que conviene que se cumpla esto que está escrito de mí: Fue contado entre los malhechores, porque se acerca el cumplimiento de todo lo que se refiere a mí". Ellos le dijeron: "Señor, aquí hay dos espadas". Él les contestó: "¡Basta ya!" Salió Jesús, como de costumbre, al monte de los Olivos y lo acompañaron los discípulos. Al llegar a ese sitio, les dijo: "Oren, para no caer en la tentación". Luego se alejó de ellos a la distancia de un tiro de piedra y se puso a orar de rodillas, diciendo: "Padre, si quieres, aparta de mí esta amarga prueba; pero que no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya". Se le apareció entonces un ángel para confortarlo; él, en su angustia mortal, oraba con mayor insistencia, y comenzó a sudar gruesas gotas de sangre, que caían hasta el suelo. Por fin terminó su oración, se levantó, fue hacia sus discípulos y los encontró dormidos por la pena. Entonces les dijo: "¿Por qué están dormidos? Levántense y oren para no caer en la tentación". Todavía estaba hablando, cuando llegó una turba encabezada por Judas, uno de los Doce, quien se acercó a Jesús para besarlo. Jesús le dijo: "Judas, ¿con un beso entregas al Hijo del hombre?" Al darse cuenta de lo que iba a suceder, los que estaban con él dijeron: "Señor, ¿los atacamos con la espada?" Y uno de ellos hirió a un criado del sumo sacerdote y le cortó la oreja derecha. Jesús intervino, diciendo: "¡Dejen! ¡Basta!" Le tocó la oreja y lo curó. Después Jesús dijo a los sumos sacerdotes, a los encargados del templo y a los ancianos que habían venido a arrestarlo: "Han venido a aprehenderme con espadas y palos, como si fuera un bandido. Todos los días he estado con ustedes en el templo y no me echaron mano. Pero ésta es su hora y la del poder de las tinieblas". Ellos lo arrestaron, se lo llevaron y lo hicieron entrar en la casa del sumo sacerdote. Pedro los seguía desde lejos. Encendieron fuego en medio del patio, se sentaron alrededor y Pedro se sentó también con ellos. Al verlo sentado junto a la lumbre, una criada se le quedó mirando y dijo: "Éste también estaba con él". Pero él lo negó diciendo: "No lo conozco, mujer". Poco después lo vio otro y le dijo: "Tú también eres uno de ellos". Pedro replicó: "¡Hombre, no lo soy!" Y como después de una hora, otro insistió: "Sin duda que éste también estaba con él, porque es galileo". Pedro contestó: "¡Hombre, no sé de qué hablas!" Todavía estaba hablando, cuando cantó un gallo. El Señor, volviéndose, miró a Pedro. Pedro se acordó entonces de las palabras que el Señor le había dicho: 'Antes de que cante el gallo, me negarás tres veces', y saliendo de allí se soltó a llorar amargamente. Los hombres que sujetaban a Jesús se burlaban de él, le daban golpes, le tapaban la cara y le preguntaban: "¿Adivina quién te ha pegado?" Y proferían contra él muchos insultos. Al amanecer se reunió el consejo de los ancianos con los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas. Hicieron comparecer a Jesús ante el sanedrín y le dijeron: "Si tú eres el Mesías, dínoslo". Él les contestó: "Si se lo digo, no lo van a creer, y si les pregunto, no me van a responder. Pero ya desde ahora, el Hijo del hombre está sentado a la derecha de Dios todopoderoso". Dijeron todos: "Entonces, ¿tú eres el Hijo de Dios?" Él les contestó: "Ustedes mismos lo han dicho: sí lo soy". Entonces ellos dijeron: "¿Qué necesidad tenemos ya de testigos? Nosotros mismo lo hemos

oído de su boca". El consejo de los ancianos, con los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas, se levantaron y llevaron a Jesús ante Pilato. Entonces comenzaron a acusarlo, diciendo: "Hemos comprobado que éste anda amotinando a nuestra nación y oponiéndose a que se pague tributo al César y diciendo que él es el Mesías rey".

Pilato preguntó a Jesús: "¿Eres tú el rey de los judíos?" El le contestó: "Tú lo has dicho". Pilato dijo a los sumos sacerdotes y a la turba: "No encuentro ninguna culpa en este hombre". Ellos insistían con más fuerza, diciendo: "Solivianta al pueblo enseñando por toda Judea, desde Galilea hasta aquí". Al oír esto, Pilato preguntó si era galileo, y al enterarse de que era de la jurisdicción de Herodes, se lo remitió, ya que Herodes estaba en Jerusalén precisamente por aquellos días. Herodes, al ver a Jesús, se puso muy contento, porque hacía mucho tiempo que quería verlo, pues había oído hablar mucho de él y esperaba presenciar algún milagro suyo. Le hizo muchas preguntas, pero él no le contestó ni una palabra. Estaban ahí los sumos sacerdotes y los escribas, acusándolo sin cesar. Entonces Herodes, con su escolta, lo trató con desprecio y se burló de él, y le mandó poner una vestidura blanca. Después se lo remitió a Pilato. Aquel mismo día se hicieron amigos Herodes y Pilato, porque antes eran enemigos. Pilato convocó a los sumos sacerdotes, a las autoridades y al pueblo, y les dijo: "Me han traído a este hombre, alegando que alborota al pueblo; pero yo lo he interrogado delante de ustedes y no he encontrado en él ninguna de las culpas de que lo acusan. Tampoco Herodes, porque me lo ha enviado de nuevo. Ya ven que ningún delito digno de muerte se ha probado. Así pues, le aplicaré un escarmiento y lo soltaré".

Con ocasión de la fiesta, Pilato tenía que dejarles libre a un preso. Ellos vociferaron en masa, diciendo: "¡Quita a ése! ¡Suéltanos a Barrabás!" A éste lo habían metido en la cárcel por una revuelta acaecida en la ciudad y un homicidio. Pilato volvió a dirigirles la palabra, con la intención de poner en libertad a Jesús; pero ellos seguían gritando: "¡Crucificalo, crucificalo!" Él les dijo por tercera vez: "¿Pues qué ha hecho de malo? No he encontrado en él ningún delito que merezca la muerte; de modo que le aplicaré un escarmiento y lo soltaré". Pero ellos insistían, pidiendo a gritos que lo crucificara. Como iba creciendo el griterío, Pilato decidió que se cumpliera su petición; soltó al que le pedían, al que había sido encarcelado por revuelta y homicidio, y a Jesús se lo entregó a su arbitrio. Mientras lo llevaban a crucificar, echaron mano a un cierto Simón de Cirene, que volvía del campo, y lo obligaron a cargar la cruz, detrás de Jesús. Lo iba siguiendo una gran multitud de hombres y mujeres, que se golpeaban el pecho y lloraban por él. Jesús se volvió hacia las mujeres y les dijo: "Hijas de Jerusalén, no lloren por mí; lloren por ustedes y por sus hijos, porque van a venir días en que se dirá: '¡Dichosas las estériles y los vientres que no han dado a luz y los pechos que no han criado!' Entonces dirán a los montes: 'Desplómense sobre nosotros', y a las colinas: 'Sepúltennos', porque si así tratan al árbol verde, ¿qué pasará con el seco?" Conducían, además, a dos malhechores, para ajusticiarlos con él. Cuando llegaron al lugar llamado "la Calavera", lo crucificaron allí, a él y a los malhechores, uno a su derecha y el otro a su izquierda. Jesús decía desde la cruz: "Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen". Los soldados se repartieron sus ropas, echando suertes. El pueblo estaba mirando. Las autoridades le hacían muecas, diciendo: "A otros ha salvado; que se salve a sí mismo, si él es el Mesías de Dios, el elegido". También los soldados se burlaban de Jesús, y acercándose a él, le ofrecían vinagre y le decían: "Si tú eres el rey de los judíos, sálvate a ti mismo". Había, en efecto, sobre la cruz, un letrero en griego, latín y hebreo, que decía: "Éste es el rey de los judíos". Uno de los malhechores crucificados insultaba a Jesús, diciéndole: "Si tú eres el Mesías, sálvate a ti mismo y a nosotros". Pero el otro le

reclamaba, indignado: "¿Ni siquiera temes tú a Dios estando en el mismo suplicio? Nosotros justamente recibimos el pago de lo que hicimos. Pero éste ningún mal ha hecho". Y le decía a Jesús: "Señor, cuando llegues a tu Reino, acuérdate de mí". Jesús le respondió: "Yo te aseguro que hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso". Era casi el mediodía, cuando las tinieblas invadieron toda la región y se oscureció el sol hasta las tres de la tarde. El velo del templo se rasgó a la mitad. Jesús, clamando con voz potente, dijo: "¡Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu!" Y dicho esto, expiró.

Aquí se arrodillan todos y se hace una breve pausa.

El oficial romano, al ver lo que pasaba, dio gloria a Dios, diciendo: "Verdaderamente este hombre era justo". Toda la muchedumbre que había acudido a este espectáculo, mirando lo que ocurría, se volvió a su casa dándose golpes de pecho. Los conocidos de Jesús se mantenían a distancia, lo mismo que las mujeres que lo habían seguido desde Galilea, y permanecían mirando todo aquello. Un hombre llamado José, consejero del sanedrín, hombre bueno y justo, que no había estado de acuerdo con la decisión de los judíos ni con sus actos, que era natural de Arimatea, ciudad de Judea, y que aguardaba el Reino de Dios, se presentó ante Pilato para pedirle el cuerpo de Jesús. Lo bajó de la cruz, lo envolvió en una sábana y lo colocó en un sepulcro excavado en la roca, donde no habían puesto a nadie todavía. Era el día de la Pascua y ya iba a empezar el sábado. Las mujeres que habían seguido a Jesús desde Galilea acompañaron a José para ver el sepulcro y cómo colocaban el cuerpo. Al regresar a su casa, prepararon perfumes y ungüentos, y el sábado guardaron reposo, conforme al mandamiento.
