The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

Please join us on Friday's immediately after the 7:30 AM Mass for Adoration. Benediction begins at 10:45 AM. It will also be broadcast on livestream @stmarkseagirt.com. Come spend some quiet time with the Lord.



Frozen Meals Program Resumes!

Are you looking for an easy way to help those in need? Here's one way you can make a difference. St. Mark's Social Concerns Ministry is resuming the Frozen Meals Program for the Center in Asbury Park which was discontinued due to the Covid pandemic. The Center in Asbury Park, Inc., is a volunteer-based New Jersey not-for-profit service organization, providing support services for people living with HIV/AIDS and their caregivers since 1992.

The process is simple! Here's what to do:

- Pick up food trays and lids next to the kitchen refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall (St. Mark's Church basement)
- Fill the trays with generous portions of food
- Label the tray lids with the contents and date of preparation
- Return the meals to the freezer compartment of the refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall.

St Mark's volunteers will deliver the meals to The Center for distribution to their clients.




Offerings at Francis House of Prayer:

Some Thoughts for April by Marge Loenser

April is a lovely name for a month. It's also a lovely name for a baby girl. It stems from the Latin word "aprillis" which means to open. So, may we assume way back in ancient Rome, they were referring to the lovely blooms that would open this month, such as daffodils, narcissus, hyacinth, tulips and even lilacs? I think so!

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 2nd. So begins the journey of Jesus from the palm strewn path He rode upon--multitudes praising "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Blessed is the King of Israel!!" Then, just five days later He walked the path of Via Dolorosa, the Way of the Cross, the day we call Good Friday. His journey ended on Golgotha, where He was nailed to the Cross. He would languish there, struggling to breathe through horrendous pain for three hours. Then at 3 O'clock, He cried out, "Father into Your hands I commend My Spirit!" He then breathed His last. When I think of that last breath of Jesus, I sigh and feel my heart cry; but His magnificent journey was not yet over because on Sunday, the third day, He gloriously rose from the dead!

"Oh glorious Easter morn, when Christ, God's only begotten Son, arose again, and over death, the final victory won.!" Praise and thank you Jesus for loving us so much that you endured so much pain and death on the Cross so that we may have eternal life with You.

Let us remember the Divine Mercy Novena and Chaplet of Divine Mercy which starts on Good Friday and ends on Mercy Sunday, the Sunday after Easter. Jesus promises great mercy and graces to those on their death beds who have venerated His mercy here on earth.

On the 25th we celebrate our wonderful patron saint, St. Mark. I love reading the gospel of St. Mark. He is a man after my own heart, in that he loves to get to the point. He uses the word "immediately" at least 41 times. St. Mark was a follower or student of St. Paul and St. Peter. His was the first gospel written in about AD 66-70. He was the founder of Christianity in Egypt or in Alexandria at least. He was killed by the pagans (dragged to death) who resented his efforts to turn them away from worshipping their pagan gods. St. Mark please continue to pray for us.

On the 29th we celebrate St. Catherine of Siena. She was a member of the 3rd Order of St. Dominic. She was a mystic, and an activist in the church. She had great influence in bringing Pope Gregory back to Rome from

Avignon in 1377. St. Catherine also had great influence on Italian literature. She was quite a spiritual force and was made doctor of the church. St. Catherine pray for us.

Well, happy Spring and most of all Happy Easter Season. Let us continue to pray for the United States of America, one country under God with liberty and justice for all (born and unborn).
