

CYO News by Mary Reilly







CYO members shared their favorite Bible stories last Lord are Sunday and one shared by Owen stuck out the most as being relevant to our evening's topic of Human Trafficking. That was the story of the Good Samaritan. A traveler was beaten, stripped of clothing, and left for dead. Others walked by him and refused to help him. The Samaritan alone helped this injured man. Our featured future Saint of our anti-trafficking meeting was Venerable Aloysius Schwartz who is the founder of World Villages(Boys Town and Girls Town) which is in seven countries and offers housing and education to 21,000 children each year—with over half of them being victims of human trafficking. In his very early priesthood right after the Korean War ended, Fr. Aloysius went to a devastated Korea for the purpose of

helping their 1000's of orphans, widows, trafficked children, lepers and all in need. After that, he never stopped assisting trafficked children for the rest of his life. World Villages' Sisters of Mary go to the biggest hell holes on earth where the traffickers prev on innocent children. The Sisters bravely rescue these children and take them to Boys Town or Girls Town where they work to restore these children to good and mental health while educating, physical catechizing, and teaching them how to protect themselves for the time they have to go back into the Likewise, in the US(Louisiana), Metanoia world. Manor sisters act as mothers of these severely wounded, trafficked children. Children there often sleep in their closets and wake up screaming in the middle of the night out of fear that they may be harmed but are then comforted by these sisters. Fr. Jeff Bayhi who founded Metanoia Manor is now traveling throughout the US to try and open up more homes for trafficked children since sex trafficking of children has become a multimillion dollar "business" here in the US.

Our CYO members, through our Christmas Wreath Sale and also our Valentine's Day Walk for Hunger, were able to make donations to both World Villages and Metanoia Manor and will also include them as CYO charities for our Emily Walker Memorial Day Walk for Hunger.

"No one can do everything, but everyone can do something." Because of our wonderful CYO angels and all of the parishioners who support their efforts, we have been able "to do something."

At our meeting, in addition to learning the various scenarios that entrap children, our CYO members also created their own scenarios and acted them out using improvisations. Their performances were both outstanding and meaningful. I think they are both ready and motivated to create their own movie on child trafficking.
