# Gospel <u>Jn 11:1-45</u>

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair: it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." hen Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill. he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus answered. "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two

miles away.

And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother.

# Jn 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you."

Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise."

Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day."

Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you."

As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him.

So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there.

When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see."

And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him."

But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it.

Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days."

Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?"

So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me.

# Mary's Child Pro-Life Ministry



Forty Days for Life: As of March 2, 192 babies have been confirmed saved due to the prayerful presence of 40 Days for Life prayer warriors throughout our country. We always feel that there are many more than these numbers rescued because their parents see us at the modern day Calvary, consider this a sign that they should choose life for their babies, and just go home. Another baby saved! It's amazing how blessed we all feel to be this presence. Being cursed and sometimes even threatened, it's a small price to pay if even one precious baby is saved. A dark and painful place each child brought there faces--that is less lonely and hopeless when not suffered alone. What we do for these babies we do for Jesus of Calvary! How blessed are we—and especially as we head toward Holy Week.

Our ministry is taking on yet another issue: human trafficking. Some of us recently attended a virtual conference on trafficking that effects 20 million of our brothers and sisters worldwide. # Some Thoughts for April by Marge Loenser

Some say April got its name from the Roman word "aprilis" which means "to open." Since such lovely blooms such as, tulips, iris, daffodils and many more, open up this month, it seems rightly named to me.

Here we are immersed in Lenten practices, preparing for Easter, which is of course, the Feast of the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and per the Father's plan, Jesus was born to be the sacrificial lamb to destroy death; to suffer and die for us; to raise Himself up from the dead to open up the gates of heaven for us. As a lowly sinner I praise and thank You, Lord! How much You suffered for us is very difficult to grasp.

The earliest Easter can fall is March 22nd, and the latest it can fall on is April 25th (which BTW is the Feast of our Patron Saint, St. Mark). The church recognizes the vernal equinox to be March 21st, or the first day of Spring. Also the early church wanted Easter to coincide with Passover, which Jesus and the apostles were celebrating before His passion. This year we celebrate Easter on April 17th.

During lent I watch Mel Gibson's movie "The Passion of the Christ." One scene that I would like to share with you was the one where Jesus, on His way to Calvary, falling beneath the weight of the cross meets His Holy Mother. His face is lacerated and He is bleeding. He can barely form words and He looks at His Mother and says: "See, I make all things new."

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, let us continue to pray for peace in the world, especially for an end to the war in Ukraine. Let us not cease to lift one another up in our daily struggles, be they physical emotional or spiritual. Please don't forget to start the Novena of the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy on Good Friday. May God grant us the grace and the strength we need each day to follow him no matter what happens. God grant us a blessed Easter.
