# Some Thoughts for April 2025

April, of course, is the fourth month of the year. Thank You, dear Lord, for this beautiful month—its lovely blooms and warmer weather. It is named after the Greek goddess of love, Aphrodite, and is known for its vibrant spring blooms. The April birth flowers are the sweet pea and the daisy. The April birthstone is the diamond. Lucky me.

Easter this year falls on April 20th. The earliest Easter can fall is March 22nd, and the latest it can fall is April 25th. On April 25th, we usually celebrate our patron saint, St. Mark, but because it falls within the octave of Easter, we will not celebrate it officially with Mass. However, we will remember to thank him and honor him in private. We love you, St. Mark—please continue to pray for us.

Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday, April 13th. Holy Thursday, the night of the Last Supper, is April 17th. Good Friday follows on the 18th. Let us not forget to start our Divine Mercy Novena, which begins on Good Friday and ends on the Sunday after Easter, which is Divine Mercy Sunday. I encourage you to read about the indulgence granted to those who participate and receive the sacrament of penance. The remission of purgatory time is truly a wonderful gift from our Lord.

On the 11th, we celebrate St. Stanislaus Kostka, patron saint of young students and seminarians. He was born in Poland in 1550 and was known for his vigorous opposition to an unjust government. St. Stanislaus, please pray for us and for more young men to heed the call to study for the priesthood. Lord, please call more workers into the vineyard.

On the 29th, we celebrate St. Catherine of Siena. She was a member of the Third Order of St. Dominic and a mystic. She had great influence in bringing the papacy back to Rome from France in the late 1300s. She is a Doctor of the Church. St. Catherine, pray for us and for our Church. I think she is the perfect saint to pray to for the holy papacy.

As we prepare ourselves for this holy Easter season, let us pray for peace in the world, for our Church, for our family members and friends who have fallen away from practicing the faith, and for a rebirth of faith and worship. Come, Holy Spirit, come.

Well, all you grandmas and grandpas, start thinking about where you will hide those Easter eggs for your grandkids. God bless us all this Lenten and Easter season. Please give us the graces we need to heed Your word and follow You each and every day!






