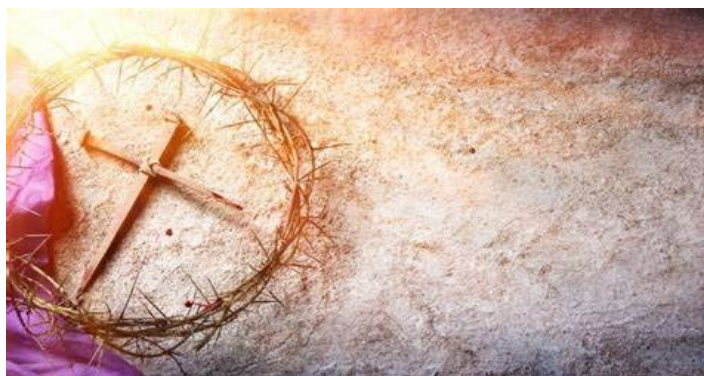

**Eucharistic Adoration:** The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament. Please join us on Friday's immediately after the 7:30 AM Mass for Adoration. Benediction begins at 10:45 AM. It will also be broadcast on livestream @ stmarkseagirt.com. Come spend some quiet time with the Lord.

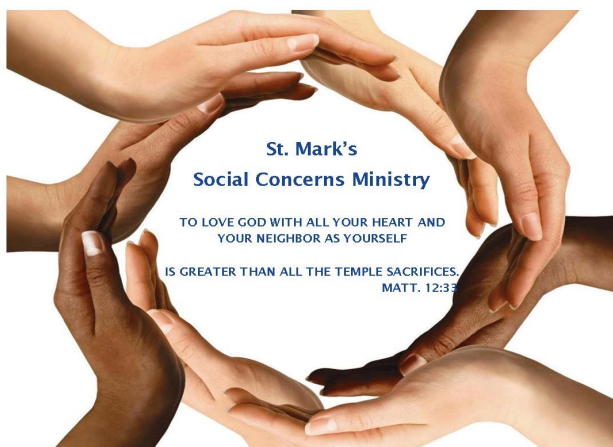
### **Invitation to Ministers:**

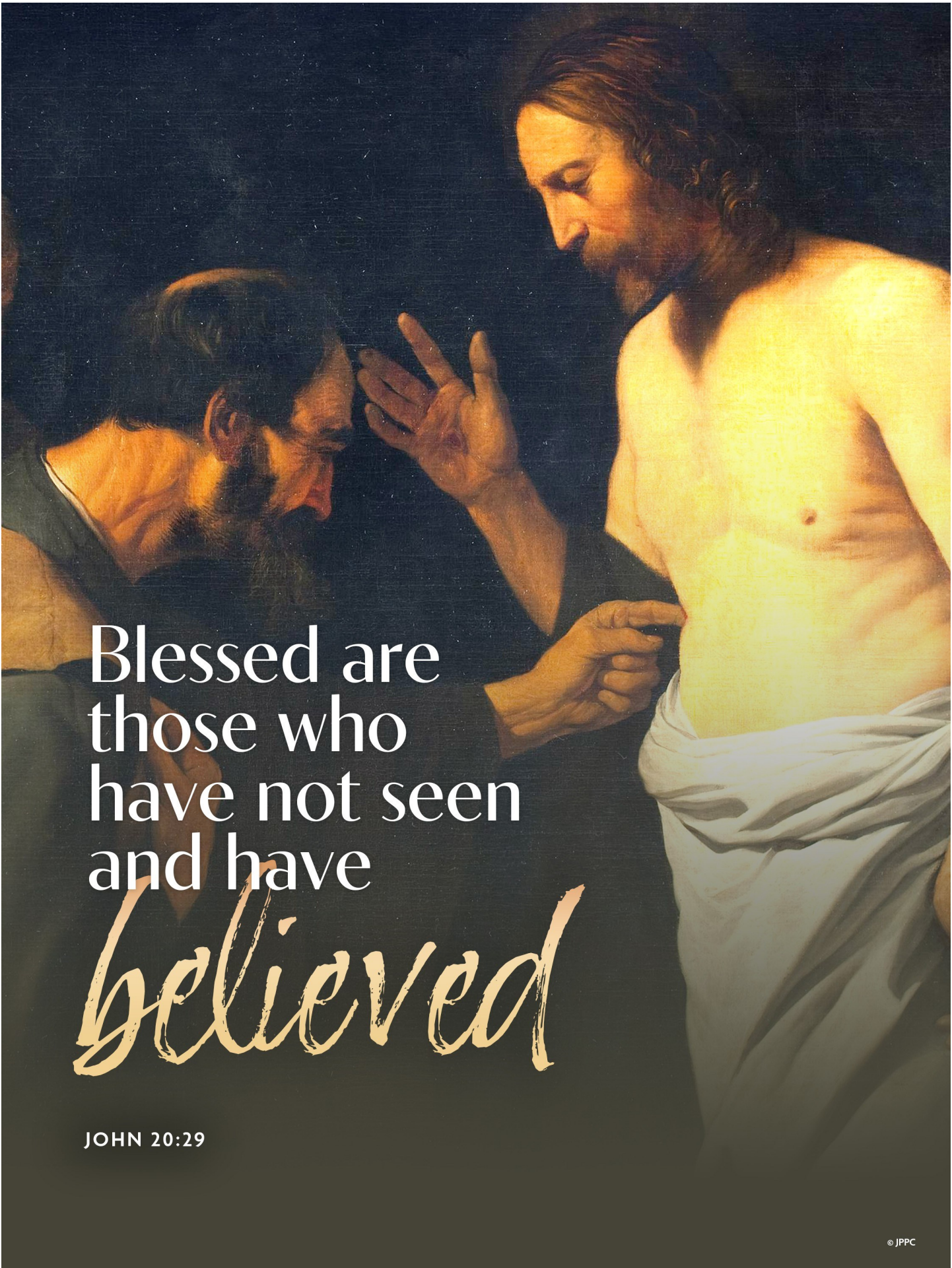

## Some Thoughts for April by Marge Loenser

I love the name "April". It congers thoughts of soft rain, early blooms, warmer weather. Welcome Spring! Here comes the lilacs, forsythia, tulips, daffodils and all sorts of blooms; they join in the symphony of color and joy!

We're in the Easter season, so we hear a lot of "Alleluias", and that's exactly what we need to hear and feel during these uncertain present times! It's a reminder that no matter what, Jesus is here. Jesus is our hope and refuge. My Jesus, I trust in You!

On the 8th we have the feast of the Annunciation. "Mary, with your consent to become the Mother of God, torrents of grace poured forth upon he earth, opening up for me a path to follow." Mary, our Mother, please pray for us.

On the 11th we celebrate St. Stanislaus Kostka, patron saint of young students and seminarians. He was born in Poland in 1550 and was known for his vigorous opposition to an unjust government. St. Stannislaus please pray for us.

On the 23rd we celebrate St. George, born in 275 A.D. He was a soldier in the Roman army, and an early church martyr. For his faith as a Christian, he was tortured and beheaded under the rule of Emperor Diocletian. Several miracles have been attributed to him -- one was of him praying over a grave; having the earth quake, the grave open, and the man raised from the dead. St. George, pray for us.

On the 25th we celebrate our very own patron, St. Mark--writer of one of the four gospels. He was a man after my own heart--he got right to the point. He used the word "Immediately" at least 21 times. He was a disciple of both St. Paul and St. Peter. He preached the gospel in Egypt or in Alexandria, and was martyred by being dragged to death. Dear St. Mark, please pray for us.

On the 29th we celebrate St. Catherine of Siena. She was a member of he third order of St. Dominic and a mystic. She had great influence in bringing he papacy back to Rome from France in the late 1300's. She was a Doctor of the church. St. Catherine, pray for us and our church.

On a personal note, I got to spend Easter with my family and was able to play with my great grandbabies, Riley and Shae. They both wore bunny ears (I didn't). God bless us all and our families and may Jesus through His holy Mother, Mary, hear our prayers and grant us answers according to His Holy will.

## CYO News by Mary Reilly

During Lent, Fr. Miguel talked about the need for each one of us to have a contemplative life. As Catholics, we say many vocal prayers at Mass, in our rosaries, and while walking the Stations of the Cross. Those who read and study the Bible, and then reflect on it, engage in another form of prayer—meditative prayer. Fr. Miguel was calling us to an even higher form of prayer—contemplative prayer. This is when we shut out everything else and focus our minds, hearts and souls on God alone.

When we attempt to engage in contemplative prayer, we often feel or hear nothing in our minds and hearts. We may even feel ignored or abandoned by God. Yet if every time we prayed to God we heard His voice and He immediately gave us what we asked for, we would probably start taking advantage of Him in selfish ways. We would have no need for faith or hope. God often stays silent...expecting us to wait on Him. He requires our patience, full trust, unfailing loyalty and complete faith.

When you are fortunate enough to feel the Almighty in your soul and hear His voice in your mind, you know exactly how much He loves you and you also learn what he expects of you. If you read the lives of the Saints and see the works they accomplish in His name, you know that they not only knew about the Master. They knew Him personally—having encountered Him in contemplative prayer.

The best ways to do any of His bidding is to first spend that time with Him in contemplative prayer. He knows exactly what He wants you to do and will never abandon you. Others most likely will hurt you and put obstacles in your way, but nothing will stop the work He sent you out to do.

Today, Divine Mercy Sunday, He gives us a special gift which we learned about from a very special Saint—St. Faustina Kowalski who had a very deep contemplative prayer life with Jesus. She told us that God expects us to be merciful and will pour out His mercy on us as well. This Sunday the soul who has gone to confession and receives the Eucharist will receive complete forgiveness of sins and any punishment due for these sins. It's like a new Baptism. He only asks us to be merciful to others (corporal and spiritual works of mercy.)

Contemplative prayers are often the most fruitful when we are in the Real Presence either at Mass or during Eucharistic adoration. We can seek His help as a spouse, a parent, a grandparent, an employer, a sibling, a pro-life warrior and in ways we serve the church (priest, sister, deacon, youth minister, etc.) God guides us, inspires us and protects us in everything. Sometimes when we engage in contemplation, it is difficult to get up and leave the church after spending precious time with Him... We often just want to stay there in a Presence that always makes us feel loved and protected.

If you seek Him in contemplation...you will find Him. “Jesus, I trust in You!”

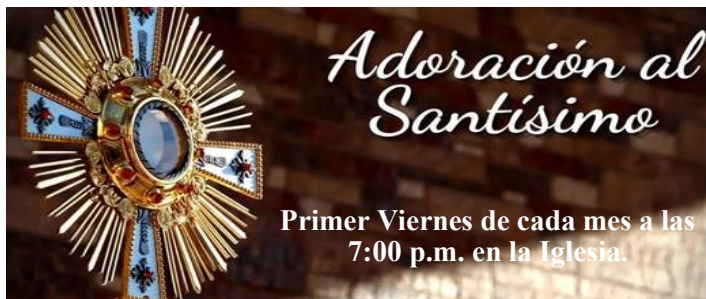

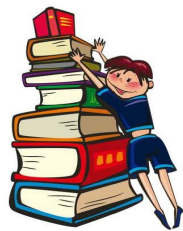
