



This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity by Jem Sullivan

While dining out, it's not uncommon to see a group of people pulling out their mobile phones as they sit down to share a meal around the table. Even as we socialize with family and friends, our electronic devices are close at hand, in case of need. I've even seen a group of college students taking photos of their meal and sharing it with the person sitting across the table!

Human beings are social creatures. We come into this world within the first community of our immediate family, and we grow and flourish in ever expanding communities at home, school and work.

And even as electronic devices have changed the way we experience social interactions, we cannot escape this basic fact of our human existence. We are essentially social beings who exist in community from beginning to end.

This Sunday, the church invites us to reflect on the divine community that exists in the very heart and life of God, who we praise as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is not a theological abstraction but a graced opportunity to contemplate the wondrous love of God who is a community of divine persons. This divine love of the Holy Trinity overflows into the world and into our lives.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit directs our gaze to a simple truth about who God is and who we are in relationship to God and one another. We believe in God who is a community of Father, Son and Holy Spirit and into whose life we are incorporated in baptism. We are baptized in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and made members of the family of God!

The psalmist invites us to praise the goodness of the divine community of Father, Son and Holy Spirit as he gives thanks for the heavens, the moon and the stars, animals, birds and fish of the sea. These marvelous works of God, the divine artist, are crowned by the creation of man and woman, created from the beginning to exist in a community of love.

As the psalmist sings, "You have made him little less than the angels and crowned him with glory and honor." The author of Proverbs echoes the same song of praise to God for creating the heavens, the seas, all earth's creatures, and for finding "delight in the human race."

In the Gospel, Jesus promises the gift of the Spirit of truth who will guide the church in the truth that comes from God. Jesus is the face of the invisible God, his Father, and their divine love is poured out in the gift of the Holy Spirit on the church.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity recalls our baptismal incorporation into the divine community of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit that deepens every time we gather around the table of the Eucharist.

And we know this with the certainty of faith "because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us," as St. Paul tells the Romans. In the joy of belonging to the community of the Holy Trinity with faith we pray, "speak to me, Lord."

Reflection Question:

What does it mean to belong through baptism in the community of the Holy Trinity?

Thank you, Fr. Jose!

One of the many things I am so grateful to Fr. Jose for is his daily homilies. Anyone who frequents the 7:30 AM daily Mass knows that when Monsignor gives a homily you are going to learn a lot more about the background story of each scripture reading. With Fr. Jose it's always his use of beautiful imagery. Recently he spoke about the Visitation and that what was most significant about it was that Mary carrying Jesus within Her was more importantly bringing Him to others (in this case Elizabeth and her family.) Fr. Jose

gave us the image of our doing the same—carrying Jesus within us and to everyone we know. Father always emphasizes the importance of parents and grandparents teaching their children and grandchildren. If we don't teach them our Catholic faith, the world will teach them something else. Another favorite image I always think of is when Fr. talks about how huge the vineyard of Christianity is—where so much has to get done. People need to learn the faith, be fed the Gospel messages, and be loved and cared for. Father paints an image of a vineyard that is huge and where work is overwhelming for the few that make sacrifices to work there. The message is—there is so much work to do to lead others to Christ and never enough people to do that work. We all have to show up. Father recently gave what I call his "Enough" homily. People say "well I go to Mass on Sunday and send a check once a year to the Missions...and that is enough." Not so. Father tells us that we have to pray and work like crazy every single day and never be content that we are doing enough for God and His children. I normally leave his Masses and keep the imagery he uses with me all day---just like when Monsignor Sean explains what was happening in the Gospel story, or the Acts of the Apostles, or in an Old Testament story, I want to go home, pull out my Bible and read more! Thank you, Father. I know that you –like the Holy Mother—will carry Jesus within you-- and to others-- wherever you go. Deus benedicat tibi

Eight months have passed since Catholic Charities Trenton appealed to parishes for donations to aid the 13,000 Afghan refugees housed at the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. Since then, our donors and parishioners have contributed over \$100,000 used to create recreational centers, theatres, barber shops and salons as well as supply medical needs like glasses and wheelchairs. Additionally, the community rallied with donations of clothes, games and toys delivered directly to the base. A big thank you to everyone who helped sustain these refugees who fled their country with only the clothes on their back.

Approximately 500 of our Afghan guests have now settled in NJ. The others have relocated through resettlement centers around the country.

The Carmel Connection Foundation

Our Lady of Mount Carmel School was established in 1923 to serve immigrant students and families in Asbury Park and the surrounding communities. As a result of the work of many dedicated educators, graduates have become doctors, nurses, engineers, educators, religious women, priests, etc.

Today there are about 200 well-motivated students in K - 8th grades, from low-income, hard-working families. Unfortunately, most families cannot afford the full tuition, and with each year comes a financial challenge to offset the resulting operating deficit. Fund-raisers like bingo, the Adopt-A-Student program, etc. are ongoing, but typically not enough.

The Carmel Connection Foundation (CCF) was established to develop an independent, dedicated multi-million-dollar endowment fund by the end of the 2023 school year, the school's 100th anniversary. The income from this fund would be sufficient to offset the school's annual operating deficit. Beyond that, additional funds will continue to be raised for future requirements of the school. **More information is available at <ccf4olmc.org>.**
