We are delighted to introduce our new vicar, Fr. Valle, who joins us with a wealth of experience, dedication, and a profound spiritual journey. Fr. Valle's path to our parish is a testament to his unwavering faith and commitment to serving God's people.

Fr. Valle comes from the vibrant city of Pereira in Colombia. His early education in his hometown laid a solid foundation for his theological pursuits. He graduated from the prestigious Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Bogotá with a degree in theology. Driven by a passion for knowledge and spiritual growth, Fr. Valle furthered his studies, earning three master's degrees—one in Holy Scripture, New Testament, another in Pastoral Theology, and a third in Literature. He also studied sociology, adding a broad perspective to his ministry.

Fr. Valle's vocation journey is inspiring. He was ordained as a deacon in 1992 in Barranquilla, Colombia, and later ordained to the priesthood on August 19, 1995, in Bogotá by Bishop Jorge Jimenez Carvajal. His calling led him to the Diocese of Trenton in July 2002, where he has since served in various parishes, each time leaving a lasting impact.

His pastoral journey in the Diocese of Trenton includes serving as Parochial Vicar at St. Joseph Church in Trenton (2002-2004), St. Anthony of Padua (2005-2007), St. Joseph Church in Toms River (2008), St. Ann's in Browns Mills (2008), St. Mary of the Lake in Lakewood (2008-2012), and St. Paul's Church in Princeton, where he served as Parochial Vicar from 2012-2020. He then became St. Paul's Parish Administrator from August to December 2020, and Pastor from 2021 to January 2024. After taking a sabbatical for a few months, he returned, demonstrating his leadership and dedication to his community.

We are blessed to have Fr. Valle assigned to St. Mark Parish by Bishop David O'Connell, effective July 1, 2024. Fr. Valle brings not only his rich educational background and extensive pastoral experience but also his deep love for the community and unwavering commitment to building God's kingdom.

Fr. Valle expresses his heartfelt joy and gratitude for the opportunity to serve as our spiritual brother and friend in Christ Jesus. He looks forward to working closely with each of us, embracing God's mission as our mission, and together, striving to create a vibrant, faith-filled community here at St. Mark Church.

CYO News by Mary Reilly



In this Year of the Eucharistic Revival, Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis for a five-day conference to build enthusiasm among the faithful to be Eucharistic missionaries. Since 2/3's of Roman Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, it is the task of the 1/3 who are believers to become Eucharistic missionaries to our families, our parishes and our ministries.

Fr. Miguel was kind enough to gift everyone in the parish with Bishop Barron's book **This is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival.** At the conclusion of his book, Bishop Barron tells us that since the Eucharist is **truly** the **power** and **presence** of God, it will change the one who consumes it.

How so? On my way to Mass recently I had just finished reading a story about an anthropologist who proposed a game to children in an African tribe. He placed a basket of fruit next to a tree and encouraged them to compete by racing to it. Whoever got there first would win all of the fruit. Instead of competing when he called the race to begin, they grasped each other's hands and ran as a group to the basket near the tree where they sat down together to enjoy the fruit. They then said, "Ubuntu, how can we be happy if the others are sad?" In the African culture Ubuntu means, "I am what I am because of who we all are."

This story reminded me so much of Jesus—at the Last Supper, during His passion, and even as He pardoned the repentant thief on the cross next to Him. He was working to achieve salvation and eternal happiness in heaven not for Himself but for anyone who took His hand and ran with Him.

We know that Jesus Himself told us that we had to (through the Eucharist) eat His body and drink His blood. The difficulty for many is they only see (and experience) bread and wine. So how can you get to a point where you know in your soul that this is truly the **body**, **blood**, **soul**, and **divinity** of Christ? Many come to this realization through Eucharistic Adoration. These are just a few of the things that believers in the Real Presence experience by adoring the Lord each week: 1) they become truly aware of God's love for them 2) they experience interior peace in their souls 3) they gain greater charity for all 4) they receive clearer insight into their unique roles and purposes of their lives 5) they better understand the gifts God gave them and how they can use them to serve Him and others 6) they burn with desire to serve God and avoid mediocrity, apathy and despair. 7) they feel a love and a peace that is incomprehensible.

I think I became and more convinced of Jesus in the Real Presence when I started to notice that at the times I am at Eucharistic Adoration it is often extremely difficult for me to leave. I feel as if an invisible presence is holding my forearms not allowing me to get up and conclude my time there. It reminds me of how some of my grandchildren are when they have to leave us after a visit. Casey, for example, will hold on to me and not let go. What happens to me at Eucharistic adoration is I often feel that Jesus is holding me there a little longer. It's a mystery to me but a lovely one.

2024 is the **perfect** time to give Jesus in the Real Presence a try. Go to Mass often, walk the Stations with Him, spend as much time as you can at Eucharistic adoration. Every Catholic Church has it. Once you try all these, you won't believe the love and the peace that will be yours. You will want to be a missionary in this ongoing Eucharistic revival where many others (the 1/3) have found this **Treasure** right here in our churches. Hopefully that will help you to live God's dream for your life!

I spent a whole lot of time thinking about those African children. One of them (the leader maybe) reached out his right arm and then his left and then the others joined in. Let's all do our part to reach out to the 2/3's who do not believe in Immanuel (God with us) just as God reached out to each of us!

SO MUCH MORE THAN A BIBLE STUDY

Ladies, Curious About Walking with Purpose?

Walking with Purpose (WWP) is comprised of women striving for a greater understanding of the Bible and the Catholic faith.
