## The Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette will preach the Annual Parish Mission Appeal this weekend, July 27-28, 2024 given by Fr. Pedro Chingandu

Having brought the fullness of Life to our world when He rose from the dead, Jesus sent his disciples to share this life with all of creation. *"They went forth and preached everywhere"* (Mk 16:20). The Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette minister to people of every race, language, culture and way of life – beginning at the La Salette Shrine in France where our Blessed Mother appeared in 1846. Her final words, *"Well, my children, you will make this known to all my people,"* echo Jesus' Gospel mandate. It is little wonder that the La Salette Congregation has always been mission orientated. When called upon by the Vatican to preach the Gospel in foreign lands, they eagerly responded. This spirit brought them to mission in 27 countries, especially among the poor in Angola, Argentina, Bolivia, Haiti, India, Madagascar, Myanmar and the Philippines. With your cooperation, the Missionaries of La Salette can continue to provide spiritual and financial assistance to these mission countries as they bring God's reconciling message to the poor.

## My Mission in Angola



My name is Pedro Chingandu. I was born in 1963 in Angola. At the age of 12, because of the civil war in Angola, my family left our home country to take refuge in a refugee camp in Zambia where I concluded my primary education, and completed my high school and philosophical Studies. I was ordained a priest in 1996. From 2000-2006, served as Regional Superior of La Salette Missionaries in Angola. In June 2006, I moved to the USA to serve at the National Shrine of Our Lady of La Salette in Attleboro. I ended my ministry in the USA in 2013 as a Parish Vicar at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in Smyrna, GA. I was then elected Provincial Superior of La Salette Missionaries in Angola serving two terms, ending in 2019.

I am currently a Parish Vicar of the newly created Parish S. Joao Maria Vianney in Luanda, Angola. I am happy to join this year's La Salette Mission Appeal Team.

The first La Salette Missionaries arrived in Angola in 1946, after the II World War. They were all from Switzerland. They were from a developed country, and opted to do their ministry in remote interior regions of Angola where they built mission parishes. In most of the mission parishes, schools, health centers or clinics were established and transformed it into a parish community.

Unfortunately, well before independence, a bloody civil war began which



destroyed most of the infrastructures built by the missionaries. The war left our once thriving mission parish communities in shambles. Fortunately, the war ended in 2002. The impact of the war had taken more than 500,000 lives, leaving thousands mutilated, and the majority living in poverty. To destroy is easy. To re-build broken hearts and restore traumatized minds are extremely difficult. This is the challenge that Angolan La Salettes are facing today. Twenty years later and with God's grace, La Salette vocations are growing. The La Salettes continue to expand their presence beyond Benguela and Huila (South), towards new territories to the east and north.



In 2020, for the very first time the Archbishop of Luanda, offered the La Salette Missionaries an area where they could build a parish. The opportunity was accepted and the new parish is in the making. The parish infrastructures are slowly being built by young La Salette Missionaries. As you can see, we have a ways to go. We need funding to continue building the church.

I look forward to my visit. Fr. Pedro Chingandu



## **CYO News by Mary Reilly**





Tests are the bane of student life. So much so that young people do not even want to talk about them on a summer vacation day in late July. But tests, we know, are a necessary component of the education process. It starts out slowly in kindergarten and stretches to graduate school.

Interestingly enough, tests of various kinds even have their place in the Bible. Even the holy Apostles had to endure them. Case in point: the perplexed apostle Philip in today's well-known episode. Jesus, who is, after all, the Master teacher observes the crowd of some ten thousand people (allowing for wives and children) who have followed Him. So, he turns to Philip and asks, "Where can we buy enough food for them?" (Please note, with a touch of humor, the complete absence of something called a "supermarket.") And then our author writes the six-word comment: "He said this to test him."

Not surprisingly, we were not given Philip's answer. But very surprising for sure was the follow up action of Jesus for both him and the other Eleven. Philip and the others will soon learn that this miracle was only a preview of another one to follow on Holy Thursday night.

For us, living some two thousand years later, we have the benefit of at least three consoling facts to hold dear in resisting the pull of our Western culture that pushes the false idea that truth is relative. First consolation: numbers are never an obstacle for almighty God's strategy. He can and does feed billions of Catholics now around the world spiritual food to energize their (and our) living out the Gospel.'

Second consolation: the Eucharist, as the true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus is the true treasure of our Church, having nothing to do with real estate or any other measurement.

Third consolation: Jesus has kept His promise to be with us "all days until the end of the age." Each holy Mass is proof. Each of us is its beneficiary. Therein lies the fact of the matter and the core of our belief. It does not change with the passage of time. Nor does it ever need updating. Only in our hearts.

There is a story of a man who came to his old friend, a music teacher, and asked him, "What's the good news today?" The old teacher was silent as he stood up and walked across the room, picked up a hammer, and struck a tuning fork. As the note sounded out through the room, he said, "That is A. It is A today; it was A five thousand years ago, and it will be A ten thousand years from now. The soprano upstairs sings off-key, the tenor across the hall flats on his high notes, and the piano downstairs is out of tune." He struck the note again and said, "That is A, my friend, and that's the good news for today."


