

Although we won't meet again until **Monday**, **September 26th**, we will be busy making Rosaries over the summer.

To clarify, we make rosary beads at our own pace and in our homes. At monthly meetings (September to June) we drop off the Rosaries we made, replenish necessary supplies (e.g., beads, string, crosses), and prepare boxes for mailing. That is, we don't make Rosary beads at the meetings. The average volunteer makes approximately 55 rosaries (ranging from 0 - 150) per month.

Making Rosaries is easy, relaxing, and very rewarding. We are in need of additional Rosary makers. Please consider volunteering for this important ministry.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament.



Catholic Charities News

Eight months have passed since Catholic Charities Trenton appealed to parishes for donations to aid the 13,000 Afghan refugees housed at the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. Since then, our donors and parishioners have contributed over \$100,000 used to create recreational centers, theatres, barber shops and salons as well as supply medical needs like glasses and wheelchairs. Additionally, the community rallied with donations of clothes, games and toys delivered directly to the base. A big thank you to everyone who helped sustain these refugees who fled their country with only the clothes on their back.

Approximately 500 of our Afghan guests have now settled in NJ. The others have relocated through resettlement centers around the country.

Frozen Meals Program Resumes! Are you looking for an easy way to help those in need? Here's one way you can make a difference. St. Mark's Social Concerns Ministry is

resuming the Frozen Meals Program for the Center in Asbury Park which was discontinued due to the Covid pandemic. The Center in Asbury Park, Inc., is a volunteer -based New Jersey not-for-profit service organization, providing support services for people living with HIV/AIDS and their caregivers since 1992.

The process is simple! Here's what to do:

- Pick up food trays and lids next to the kitchen refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall (St. Mark's Church basement)
- Fill the trays with generous portions of food
- Label the tray lids with the contents and date of preparation
- Return the meals to the freezer compartment of the refrigerator in Fr. Child's Hall.

St Mark's volunteers will deliver the meals to The Center for distribution to their clients.

LORD, accept our gifts

The Carmel Connection Foundation

Our Lady of Mount Carmel School was established in 1923 to serve immigrant students and families in Asbury Park and the surrounding communities. As a result of the work of many dedicated educators, graduates have become doctors, nurses, engineers, educators, religious women, priests, etc.

Today there are about 200 well-motivated students in K-8th grades, from low-income, hard-working families. Unfortunately, most families cannot afford the full tuition, and with each year comes a financial challenge to offset the resulting operating deficit. Fund-raisers like bingo, the Adopt-A-Student program, etc. are ongoing, but typically not enough.

The Carmel Connection Foundation (CCF) was established to develop an independent, dedicated multi-million-dollar endowment fund by the end of the 2023 school year, the school's 100th anniversary. The income from this fund would be sufficient to offset the school's annual operating deficit. Beyond that, additional funds will continue to be raised for future requirements of the school.
