

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

The Social Concerns Ministry has been an integral part of the St. Mark's parish community for many years. With over 35 members, we are an active and vibrant organization.

There will be a special collection **next weekend**, **July 12th and 13th**, to support our neighbors in need. Your generous donations are critical to continuing the activities of this important ministry. Please read the description below of the many support programs in which Social Concerns is involved.

Our ministries include:

<u>Helping Hands</u> – provides emergency financial assistance to individuals and families in lower Monmouth County who are unable to pay rent, mortgage, utilities, etc. In addition to providing direct assistance, we often partner with other local churches.

Ministry of Hope - meets with grieving families to help them plan the funeral for their loved ones.

<u>Giving Tree</u> – provides gifts, food and gift cards at Christmastime to needy families and local organizations. Over 600 gifts were distributed in 2024.

<u>Mercy Center</u> - volunteers regularly deliver donations of food and toiletries from parishioners and work in the food pantry.

Thanksgiving Food Drive – provides food for Thanksgiving dinners.

Tender Loving Care - provides bags of cookies and candy to those living alone or are ill at the holidays.

The Center - volunteers deliver frozen dinners cooked by parishioners to The Center in Asbury Park.

Knitters Group - provides prayer shawls to those who are sick, and blankets and mittens to children.

In addition, we provide support for the various needs of the children and families at Our Lady of Mount Carmel School in Asbury Park. We continue to provide tuition assistance for needy students. In our own parish, we provide customized T-shirts for St. Mark's CYO's charitable activities.

Thank you so much for your support this past year. Your help with this year's Social Concerns collection would be most appreciated. We can assure you that 100% of your contributions are put to good use. In addition, if you would like to participate in any of our ministries, you can contact us at extension 108 at the rectory or join us at our next meeting on September 9th at noon in Father Childs Hall.

Some Thoughts for July by Marge Loenser

Thank You, God, for the lovely month of July. It's known for being the warmest month of the year in the Northern Hemisphere, and the coldest month of the year in the Southern Hemisphere. It is warmest due to the increased daylight hours and Earth's position in relation to the sun.

The birthstone for July is the ruby, and the flower is the larkspur. I know we all remember it got its name from Emperor Julius Caesar. Mostly, thank You, God, for my Charlene, born July 28, 1963, now in Heaven with the angels.

The month of July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. To name a few saints of the month, we have: on the first, St. Junípero Serra; on the third, the Apostle St. Thomas; on the eleventh, St. Benedict; the fourteenth is St. Kateri Tekakwitha; on the 22nd, St. Mary Magdalene; on the 25th, we celebrate St. James, Apostle; on the 26th, the parents of our Blessed Mother Mary—Sts. Joachim and Anna; on the 29th, Sts. Martha, Mary, and Lazarus; and on the 31st, St. Ignatius of Loyola.

I love the Apostle St. Thomas. I think he got a bad "rap" as "Doubting Thomas." It could have been any one of the apostles who were absent who might have had doubts. Jesus uses Thomas to show an everlasting picture of His Resurrected Body. The scene shows absolutely that Jesus was alive again when He had Thomas put his hand into the nail holes in His hands and into His pierced side. I like the role of St. Thomas in the series *The Chosen*, where he is a wine merchant and caterer at the wedding feast of Cana.

We don't hear much talk about the young Native American St. Kateri. She became known as the "Lily of the Mohawks." She was born in Auriesville, New York, in the 17th century, and she was the only member of her family to survive a smallpox epidemic, which left her facially scarred and visually impaired. Her mother was a Christianized Algonquin, and her father was a Mohawk. She is remembered for her charity and her holiness. She is the first Native American to be proclaimed a saint. St. Kateri, pray for us and your people.

St. James, Apostle and brother to St. John, was the first apostle to be martyred. He proclaimed the Gospel to the area now called Spain and is memorialized at Santiago de Compostela, a very famous pilgrimage site.

St. Joachim and St. Anne, parents of our Holy Mother Mary—tradition tells us—were from Nazareth. St. Joachim was a descendant of David from the tribe of Judah, and St. Anne was from the tribe of Levi. It is said they prayed for a child for twenty years and promised God that when they had a child, it would be consecrated to Him, the Most High God. Mary was conceived by their union, and at the moment of her conception, God proclaimed her free from original sin—and that very moment was the Immaculate Conception. Dear Anna and Joachim, pray for our children and grandchildren.

We are all familiar with Martha, Mary, and Lazarus as close friends and patrons of Jesus when He and the apostles traveled the area of Judea, which encapsulated all the area near Jerusalem. When Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, it was His final miracle—the one that led to His persecution and, soon after, His crucifixion. I love the way *The Chosen* series shows us so much of the home and hospitality of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus apparently wealthy and devoted Jews.

Well, I've run out of space on this page, so I will ask God to bless us all, each one.
