Dear Parishioners of St. Mark Parish,

We are delighted to introduce our new vicar, Fr. Valle, who joins us with a wealth of experience, dedication, and a profound spiritual journey. Fr. Valle's path to our parish is a testament to his unwavering faith and commitment to serving God's people.

Fr. Valle comes from the vibrant city of Pereira in Colombia. His early education in his hometown laid a solid foundation for his theological pursuits. He graduated from the prestigious Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Bogotá with a degree in theology. Driven by a passion for knowledge and spiritual growth, Fr. Valle furthered his studies, earning three master's degrees—one in Holy Scripture, New Testament, another in Pastoral Theology, and a third in Literature. He also studied sociology, adding a broad perspective to his ministry.

Fr. Valle's vocation journey is inspiring. He was ordained as a deacon in 1992 in Barranquilla, Colombia, and later ordained to the priesthood on August 19, 1995, in Bogotá by Bishop Jorge Jimenez Carvajal. His calling led him to the Diocese of Trenton in July 2002, where he has since served in various parishes, each time leaving a lasting impact.

His pastoral journey in the Diocese of Trenton includes serving as Parochial Vicar at St. Joseph Church in Trenton (2002 - 2004), St. Anthony of Padua (2005 - 2007), St. Joseph Church in Toms River (2008), St. Ann's in Browns Mills (2008), St. Mary of the Lake in Lakewood (2008 - 2012), and St. Paul's Church in Princeton, where he served as Parochial Vicar from 2012 - 2020. He then became St. Paul's Parish Administrator from August to December 2020, and Pastor from 2021 to January 2024. After taking a sabbatical for a few months, he returned, demonstrating his leadership and dedication to his community.

We are blessed to have Fr. Valle assigned to St. Mark Parish by Bishop David O'Connell, effective July 1, 2024. Fr. Valle brings not only his rich educational background and extensive pastoral experience but also his deep love for the community and unwavering commitment to building God's kingdom.

Fr. Valle expresses his heartfelt joy and gratitude for the opportunity to serve as our spiritual brother and friend in Christ Jesus. He looks forward to working closely with each of us, embracing God's mission as our mission, and together, striving to create a vibrant, faith-filled community here at St. Mark Church.

There will be a special collection on the weekend of July 13th and 14th to support St. Mark's Social Concerns Ministry. Your generous donations are critical to continuing the activities of this important ministry. Please read the description below of the many support programs in which Social Concerns is involved.

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

The Social Concerns Ministry has been an integral part of the St. Mark's parish community for many years. With over 50 members, we are an active and vibrant organization.

Our ministries include:

Helping Hands – provides emergency financial assistance to individuals and families who are unable to pay rent, mortgage, utilities, etc. In addition to providing direct assistance, we often partner with other local churches

Ministry of Hope - meets with grieving families to help them plan the funeral for their loved one.

Giving Tree – provides gifts, food and gift cards to needy families. Over 550 gifts were distributed in 2023.

Mercy Center - volunteers regularly deliver donations of food and toiletries from parishioners and work in the food pantry.

Thanksgiving Food Drive – provides food for Thanksgiving dinners.

Tender Loving Care - provides bags of cookies and candy to those living alone or ill at the holidays.

The Center - volunteers deliver frozen dinners cooked by parishioners to The Center in Asbury.

Knitters Group - provides prayer shawls to those who are sick, and blankets and mittens to children.

In addition, we provide support for the various needs of the children and families at Our Lady of Mount Carmel School in Asbury Park. We donated school supplies and stocked the nurse's office with critical supplies. We continue to provide tuition assistance for needy students. In our own parish, we provide customized T-shirts for St. Mark's CYO's charitable activities.

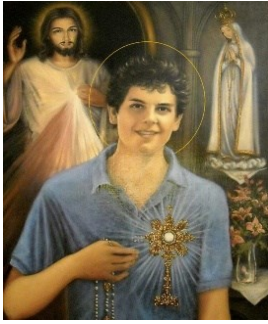

In this year of Eucharistic Revival, Pope Francis will be meeting on July 1 with other church leaders to determine a date for the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis—a child saint(1990-2005) who loved the Eucharist and researched and catalogued many Eucharistic miracles(as well as Marian apparitions.) Carlo went to Mass each day and prayed in the Real Presence before and after every Mass. He prayed especially for the souls in Purgatory.

Of the Eucharist he said....

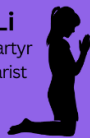
“I think that many people do not fully understand the value of the Mass, because if they recognized the enormous blessing we have in a Lord Who gives Himself as our food and drink in the Sacred Host, they would go to Mass every day to participate in the fruits of the sacrifice and let go of so many superfluous things.”



“Perhaps people haven’t really understood! Jesus is present among us in His very Body just as He was during His mortal life among His friends. If we reflect on this seriously, we would never leave Him alone in the tabernacle waiting for us with love, wanting to help us on our earthly journey.”

St. Tarcisus was a young martyr for the Eucharist. Setting out from the catacombs, he was bringing the Eucharist to his brother and sister Christians imprisoned and awaiting their executions. He was murdered by his friends while protecting the Eucharist. A soldier saw what happened and carried him home to his family. As sad as his story is, I can’t imagine a greater love for Jesus in the Eucharist than to lay down one’s life to protect Him. Archbishop Sheen’s favorite was Little Li who was shot dead in China also while trying to protect the Holy Eucharist.

Saint Mark’s Rosary Makers

At our June meeting, we gave a heartfelt **Thank You to Pam Zusi**, who for many years, diligently and generously kept our closet stocked with all of the items needed to make rosaries. Although she plans to continue making rosaries and attending our meetings, Pam will no longer have to transport boxes of supplies from her house to Saint Mark’s! Thank you, Pam!!!!

Since September, we have mailed out over 5500 rosaries to various ministries. Each month we send seven or eight boxes of approximately 70 rosaries each to hospitals, missions, prisons, schools, and other Catholic organizations. Although we won't meet again until **Monday, September 30th**, we will be busy making rosaries over the summer.

Volunteers make rosary beads at their own pace and in their homes. At monthly meetings (September to June) we drop off the rosaries we made, replenish necessary supplies (e.g., beads, string, crosses), and prepare boxes for mailing. That is, we don't make rosary beads at the meetings. The average volunteer makes approximately 50 rosaries (ranging from 0 - 110) per month.

Making rosaries is easy, relaxing, and very rewarding. We are fortunate that several people have joined our ministry this past year. However, we are always in need of additional rosary makers. Please consider volunteering for this important ministry.
