



To me September is bittersweet. Its sad to see summer fading away, days getting shorter, vacations ending, enjoying being outside; yet there's the excitement of a new school season, autumn weather, fall holidays, and going for walks and so much more.

There are a lot of events this month. On the 8th we celebrate the birthday of our Blessed Mother. On the 11th, of course, we take time out to remember that very tragic day in 2001. We lift up to God all the souls that died and we ask God's healing for all the families that lost loved ones. We pray especially for our country. God please save the USA.

We celebrate Our Lady of Sorrows on the 15th and we pray each of the seven sorrows with her. We think of how saddened Mary was at the words of Simeon at the Presentation: "Your own heart a sword shall pierce." The second sorrow was when Joseph took Mary and Baby Jesus in the dark of the night away to the far land of Egypt to escape the murderous Herod. 
