



#### Process to Verify Marriage Validity Verification process for <u>parish registrations</u> (couples register through the parish office)

- Couples are *not* required to provide a Catholic marriage certificate
- Verification is given for couples who provide:
  - 1.. Name and city of Catholic parish of marriage
  - 2. Date of Catholic marriage
- •If another site for the marriage is listed (e.g. chapel, non-Catholic church or other site), the couple should be able to state that their marriage is valid in the Catholic Church (they received official permission/dispensation to marry in a place other than a Catholic church).
- •Couples who are unsure of the validity of their Catholic marriage should be referred to a priest of deacon of the parish. This is a great opportunity to regularize the situation of couples not married in the Church.

#### Verification process for <u>online registrations</u> (couples preregister online)

- •Peg Hensler or Jossie Ramos of the Dept. of Evangelization & Family life will notify couples directly that their registration is approved if they provide the parish and date of Catholic marrriage
- •If a non-Catholic site for the marriage is listed, we will contact the couple directly to ascertain whether they were married validly in the Church.
- If questions persist, we will contact the couple's current parish for verification of Catholic marriage.
- •As we get closer to the Anniversary Blessing events we will provide all parishes with a complete list of couples from their parish who will be participating in the Anniversary Blessing.





