

Third Sunday of Lent Year C

Lectionary: 30

Reading I <u>Ex 3:1-8a, 13-15</u>

Moses was tending the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian.

Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God.

There an angel of the LORD appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush.

As he looked on, he was surprised to see that the bush, though on fire, was not consumed.

So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned."

When the LORD saw him coming over to look at it more closely, God called out to him from the bush, "Moses! Moses!"

He answered, "Here I am."

Matthew 25:40

It seems safe to conclude that those very few supporters of Jesus who chose to be at His side at Calvary were very frightened that day. For those in our ministry who have committed to spend time at what some call the modern day Calvary where the unborn are also unjustly led to their deaths, there was also a level of fear the first time we did this. You don't know what someone will call you or if someone will threaten you. We could not be there with Him in the desert or at Calvary 2000 years ago...but in prayer, fasting, and seeking out those also rejected and abandoned by this world, we can be there for Him today. Primera Lectura: Ex 3, 1-8a. 13-15. En aquellos días, Moisés pastoreaba el rebaño de su suegro, Jetró, sacerdote de Madián. En cierta
