

NJ Independent Victims Compensation Program is Open


As had been announced in February of this year, the Diocese of Trenton–along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey –has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Diocese. The IVCP was open to claims beginning June 15.

The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros. Mr. Feinberg was the plan administrator for the federal 9/11 victim compensation program, as well as the Boston Marathon bombing compensation program.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and will operate independently of the Diocese or any Church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims–no matter when the abuse occurred–are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to <u>www.njdiocesesivcp.com</u> and reviewing the Protocol for submitting a claim.

Anyone who was sexually victimized as a minor by a priest or deacon of the Diocese is strongly encouraged to participate in the IVCP. The Diocese also asks that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to pass along this information to the victim so that he or she is aware of the IVCP.



Throughout the year, more than 25 volunteers are needed to help with rotating shifts on Tuesday and Thursday mornings in the Social Concerns office located in the Rectory library. This Helping Hands program is the cornerstone of our outreach programs. Through this program, people from our own neighborhoods who have shown to be in legitimate need are given help to restore electricity, heat and water, and forestall evictions. They may also receive food, clothing and furniture at times. Most of the people who need assistance are the unemployed, underpaid, disabled, seriously ill or senior citizens on a fixed income who, for various

reasons, do not qualify for other government-sponsored programs.

Office volunteers are very much needed and training is provided. If you have time to offer, please call our Social Concerns number at 732-449-6364 ext. 108 or fill out the volunteer form and check "Helping Hands."

Local Pantry

Groceries for the Mercy Center Food Pantry are donated by parishioners and friends and placed into the collection boxes at the Church entrances. The second weekend of every month is St. Mark's designated donation time. When possible, volunteers deliver these items on a weekly basis. These contributions help keep this food pantry's shelves filled with a variety of foods and canned goods. Volunteers from St. Mark's donate two hours a week to work in the kitchen or to stock shelves and fill orders. Thanks to the loving kindness of our volunteers, the Mercy Center helps many struggling individuals and families gain access to groceries each week.

Thanksgiving Baskets

The collecting of food and delivering of Thanksgiving baskets is an annual collaborative effort headed by this Social Concerns committee. Most of the baskets are delivered to about 30 homes throughout the neighboring towns. Food is also given to the Mercy Center and Our Lady of Providence in Neptune. When Thanksgiving Day approaches, volunteers help to seek out those in need. Local community organizations, including the Women's Club of Sea Girt and HabCore, lend support. With the money donated to Social Concerns, members hunt for sales and buy any item that has not already been given but is needed to complete the baskets. The effort starts in September with the compiling of the list of volunteers. Those who sign up will be invited to an October meeting at which time the tasks will be assigned. Volunteers who

like to help the parish but are unable to make a year-long commitment can enjoy participating in this seasonal effort.

The Center

The Center in Asbury Park offers a hot meal to the homeless and those afflicted with HIV/AIDS. Parishioners prepare meals at home and place them in St. Mark's basement freezer for volunteers to bring to The Center each week. These prepared dinners are then distributed to people who do not have the facilities to make their own meals. Other volunteers work in the Center's kitchen on a weekday, Monday through Friday, to make a hot lunch that is served on site.

Meals on Wheels

Volunteers from Social Concerns spend one hour each weekday to help deliver a hot meal and cheerful greetings to nearby homes in the Belmar and Wall Twp. areas. Volunteers pick up food trays from a convenient central location and take the trays to the homes on their assigned route.

Ministry of Hope

This Ministry supports, listens, consoles and comforts parishioners when a loved one dies. They help the bereaved to choose the readings and select the music. They also support the family at the wake, funeral or memorial Mass. They keep in touch with the family members over the difficult first year to see if they are in need of any assistance.

Ministry to the Aging

This Ministry visits the aging in five area nursing homes, one each weekday from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. Residents who would like to participate are gathered together by the nursing staff. Between 35 and 40 regularly join in for prayers and petitions. Guests and staff often notice the peace after each gathering. If you can help even once a week, you'll make that day brighter for our local nursing home residents.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

Our Prayer Shawl Ministry continues to be a huge success. Members gather weekly on Thursdays at 1:30 PM in the Rectory living room. The shawl maker begins with prayers and blessings for the recipient. The intentions continue throughout the crocheting or knitting of the shawl. When a shawl is finished, a final blessing is offered by our clergy before the shawl is delivered. Any parishioner who is ill or suffering in any way, or knows anyone who could use the comfort of a prayer shawl, should contact Social Concerns.

Tender Loving Care

Several holidays a year, Social Concerns volunteers join other Church organizations to package and deliver goodie bags. The Altar Rosary Society assists with these activities throughout the year. The Sea Girt Holly Club donates beautiful floral creations which our volunteers bring to assisted-living centers and the homebound.

Giving Tree

At Christmas, our Giving Tree members join in the community efforts to bring Christmas gifts to local children and families in need, as well as those who are being helped by Mercy Center, Epiphany House, Spring House, Our Lady of Providence and

Madonna House. Those who lead the effort spend hundreds of hours requesting, collecting, sorting, wrapping and delivering gifts.

As a volunteer in this program you will be asked to invest a few hours during a busy time of year. However, the rewards can be enormous. Thanks to the generosity of St. Mark's parishioners, families and friends, many needy local children receive Christmas gifts. Volunteers love to describe the reaction of the children to the gifts they receive, and their joy when they show them to their families.

The Social Concerns Ministry meets at 12 Noon on the second Tuesday of the month (September through June). It's not only a terrific way to volunteer your time-weekly, monthly or seasonally-it's a great chance to make some new friends.
