

July Prayer Petitions by Marge Loenser

On July 4th, 1776, the Continental Congress, made up of 13 colonies, including New Jersey, officially declared independence from England. Here we stand 243 years later, 50 states in all, one nation under God with liberty and justice for all! We pray for born and unborn alike!

This month, among others, we celebrate saints that walked with Jesus. We start with St. Thomas. We mostly remember him as "Doubting Thomas," but let us remember after he himself saw Jesus, he later became a dedicated evangelist and traveled as far out of the Roman empire as India, establishing many churches. We celebrate St. Mary Magdalene on the 22nd. Jesus was said to have exorcised 7 demons from Mary. There is a strong legend that she was the sister of Lazarus and Martha. There is the Society of St. Mary Magdalene located in South Carolina that espouses that idea. This society was approved by the Dominicans in France who are guardians of St. Mary Magdalene's relics there.

The next saint from Jesus' inner circle is St. James, brother of John (sons of thunder as Jesus called them) who evangelized as far as Spain. His remains are in northwest Spain at the famous pilgrimage site of Santiago de Compostella. I was blessed to have visited this site. I understand our own Father Jose is from that area in Spain. Finally we have St. Martha, of whom Jesus said, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better and it will not be taken away from her."

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, let us remember to pray for all the prayer petitions from St. Mark's. We lift up the sick and their caretakers, also those in hospitals and rehabs. May those with addictions allow the Holy Spirit to wake them from their denial and to see the unmanageability of their lives. We pray for our Church, for healing and justice, and for our country so divided.

We pray that our people remember that we are one nation, under God. The further we stray from God, the more we will experience the lack of value to human life, and immorality will continue to spread.

Hear our prayers, Jesus. We love our Church and our country, but we need You to get us on the right path.

My daughter Celeste and her husband John are traveling to Ireland and will be stopping in Tipperary to trace our family's roots, the O'Sullivans. I pray for a safe trip and the luck of the Irish.

The Spiritual Birthplace of the Republic by Joanne Gibson

Built in 1766, St. Paul's Chapel was erected 10 years before the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The original art over the altar depicting Mt. Sinai in clouds and lightning and two tablets of the Law with the Ten Commandments was the work of Pierre L'Enfant, who designed Washington, D.C. For that first decade, the chapel was technically the property of King George III. It was built in a field some distance from the growing port city to the south.

Before George Washington became the first president, he attended services at St. Paul's Chapel whenever the Continental Army was in New York during the Revolutionary War. In fact, during the very first days of the American Revolution, the invasion of British troops sparked a tragedy referred to as the Great Fire of 1776, which destroyed 432 structures in New York. The fire spread to St. Paul's Chapel and very nearly overwhelmed it, but a bucket brigade managed to put it out. It would be 225 years later that the chapel would be spared during another devastating fire.

But it was back in 1789, at a joint session of the 1st Congress for the inauguration of the president when Washington would give this prophetic warning, "We ought to be no less persuaded that the propitious smiles of heaven can never be expected on a nation that disregards the eternal rules of order and the right which heaven itself has ordained."

Washington's warning meant that if as a nation we ever departed from God, He would remove His blessings, His prosperity and His protection.

As each member of Congress and the President were sworn in, they established the following precedents:

- 1. the use of the Bible to administer the oath,
- 2. affirming the religious nature of the oath by the adding the prayer "So help me God!" to the oath, and
- 3. inaugural worship services attended en masse by Congress as an official part of congressional activities.

After the inaugural address at the Federal Hall, all the members of the House and Senate, led by America's first president, traveled on foot to St. Paul's Chapel. While there are no records of what was said inside, we do know the entire congregation was on their knees praying for 2 hours and consecrating this nation to God. A plaque above Washington's pew reads: "Almighty God, we make our earnest prayer that you will keep the United States in Holy protection."

On September 11, 2001, St. Paul's Chapel, which sits directly across the street from the World Trade Center site, suffered no physical damage. No, not a single pane of glass was broken and the steeple remained intact. The dust rendered the 200-year-old organ unusable and covered the churchyard and cemetery, but no headstone was destroyed. One tree was felled, a 100-year-old giant sycamore, but according to the Associated Press, it was that tree that "prevented a huge steel beam from smashing the church to splinters."

Soon after the twin towers collapsed, the chapel was opened to provide food and drinks and medical attention to first responders and recovery crews. It became a sanctuary for over 2,000 workers each day. In 12-hour shifts, medical personnel cared for the tired and injured at the same site where the new government officials had prayed. Apparently, podiatrists used George Washington's presidential pew to bandage and treat tired, injured feet.

When the towers fell on September 11, 2001, half of the Federal Hall foundation cracked. Joseph T. Avery, superintendent of Manhattan sites for the National Park Service, was shocked to see no soil but 24 inches of air under one of the columns. Emergency repairs kept the building from collapsing. But why only half of the foundation? Because half of the building is built over sandy landfill and the other half over bedrock.


