**Volunteers Needed** If you can spare a few hours a month, we need you. The paperwork and mailing take approximately two hours a month but without assistance, these devoted volunteers may not be able to continue spreading Our Lady's message to "Pray the Rosary". Additional rosary makers are always needed but without assistance with these clerical duties, our rosary makers may not be able to continue their mission.

During this time the need is so much greater. We have numerous requests for the rosaries.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.






