## **November 1, 2020 ~ Solemnity of All Saints**

**Lectionary: 667**

**Reading 1**

**RV 7:2-4, 9-14**

I, John, saw another angel come up from the East, holding the seal of the living God.

He cried out in a loud voice to the four angels who were given power to damage the land and the sea, "Do not damage the land or the sea or the trees until we put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God." I heard the number of those who had been marked with the seal, one hundred and forty-four thousand marked from every tribe of the children of Israel. After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb." 

St. Mark's would like to let our Parishioners know what practices we have in place to protect them during the pandemic so that they can make informed decisions on whether they feel they would like to attend in person Masses. Social distancing with roped off pews which allows those present to sit at least 6 feet apart, all pews, door handles and railings are sanitized after every Mass daily and during the weekend Masses and Sacraments, sanitizer is at the front and side entrances, bathrooms are cleaned and sanitized on a regular basis, masks must be worn by everyone in the church, the priests and Extraordinary Ministers use hand sanitizer before distributing Communion, Communion is distributed one side at a time to allow for social distance, the windows are open during Mass to help circulate air, collection baskets are placed on the Altar rail rather than the Ushers handling the collection, weekend requirement is entrance thru the front doors for Parishioner count but you may exit thru all doors.

## November Thoughts Marge Loenser 2020

Our Father, Master Creator, Master Artist, paints November's tapestry with bright, bold colors! We see fields of orange pumpkins, forests of trees waving leaves that are scarlet, gold, red and yellow! How beautiful. Thank you Lord for the beauty of your creation that we can delight in each day.

November starts out with All Saints Day, followed by All Souls Day. This month we celebrate two Saint Martins! On the third, St. Martin de Porres, son of a Spanish nobleman and a Panamanian ex-slave. He was poor and suffered much for his mixed racial origin. He was very humble and worked in an infirmary. He died in 1639. We pray for his intercession during these times of racial tension and violence.

St Martin of Tours from the 4<sup>th</sup> century is remembered for the act of charity he performed. While serving in the Roman army he came upon a half-clothed man, drew his sword and cut his cape in two, giving half to the poor man. Later that night he saw Jesus in a vision explaining how Martin shared his cloak with Him. I love that story and I'm so proud to have received First Holy Communion and Confirmation at St. Martin of Tours church, Brooklyn, NY!

Another saint we celebrate this month, is St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, better known as 'Mother Cabrini.' Frances emigrated to this country from Italy. She worked with poor immigrants and was the first U.S. citizen to become a saint. Having descended from Italian immigrants, I say "thank you Mother for working with those newly arrived immigrants who desperately needed your guidance and advocacy."

On the 24<sup>th</sup> we celebrate St. Andrew Dung -Lac and his companions. They were part of 117 martyrs from Vietnam. They suffered all manner of cruelty and torture, but refused to denounce their faith. We ask for their intercession for all peoples being murdered, tortured and held captive for their faith.

We celebrate St. Andrew, Peter's brother on the 30<sup>th</sup>. He was a follower of St. John the Baptist and was instrumental in bringing the other fishermen to Jesus. St. Andrew, it must have humbled you to live in the shadow of your brother, St. Peter, but you show those of us living simply how God uses all of us to carry out his work, regardless of our status or popularity, so long as we say, yes to Jesus--here I am, Jesus.

Let us pray for the sick, especially those in hospitals, nursing homes and rehabs. We lift up those tempted to turn to drugs and alcohol during these trying times. One day at a time, we can surrender to God and ask for His Divine intervention.

God bless America this Thanksgiving! May we remember to thank God for everything He does for us.

## Please Help **Food Donations Needed**

The Pantry is rocking and rolling -- number of families are moving back up: pre-Covid we averaged 30-35 families a day; that number spiked to 60 in May, then dropped back down in June and July, back up to 40 in August and 50 in September. One day last week, we provided food to 87 families! The good news is that food is again plentiful from the FoodBank. There are still some items that we are not able to get in sufficient quantity and are buying retail, but we are able to provide a lot of food and a lot of variety to everyone. Praise be.

We are very lucky that our volunteer force has continued to replenish. The Pantry has a great reputation, and we are receiving inquiries about volunteering nearly every day. So, as current volunteers peel off for one reason or another, we have been able to seed in new folk. Praise be.

**Thanksgiving:** We finished registrations for our annual Thanksgiving distribution last week. The big change this year is that we will be set up on Ocean Ave, near the Gazebo, for a "pop-the-trunk" distribution this year. All registrants have been given a postcard-sized "ticket," cars will line up on Ocean Ave, driver will hand us the "ticket," then will pop the trunk, and we will put a turkey and a box of all the fixin's right into the trunk. WE WILL NEED A LOT OF HELP ALL DAY -- we hope to have 2 hour shifts, knowing it may be cold. We will need muscle to load the cars, but we also need people to fill the boxes (we will fill the boxes right there on site), someone to collect the "tickets," someone to "make" the boxes (pop them open and tape the bottoms), and other tasks. If you can help, please email me at [bradleyfoodpantry@gmail.com](mailto:bradleyfoodpantry@gmail.com) so we can begin to create a schedule. Distribution day is Friday, November 20, from 8:30am to 7:00 pm.

**Christmas:** We have not finalized plans for our Christmas distribution. Although we would love to wait to see how Thanksgiving goes, we just can't wait that long to plan for Christmas. Distribution day will be the Friday before Christmas, December 18, all day. The leaders of St. James are thinking about how we might do toys this year – more info to come in a few weeks.

Once again, I thank you for your unwavering support. We are blessed to be situated in an abundantly generous community and to have abundantly generous volunteers and supporters. Thank you . . . Thank you . . . Thank you. Praise be.



## Vatican extends time to obtain full indulgences for souls in purgatory

VATICAN CITY (CNS) — Plenary or full indulgences traditionally obtained during the first week of November for the souls of the faithful in purgatory can now be gained throughout the entire month of November, the Vatican said.

Also, those who are ill or homebound and would not be able to physically visit a church or cemetery in the prescribed timeframe still will be able to receive a plenary indulgence when meeting certain conditions, the Apostolic Penitentiary, a Vatican tribunal that deals with matters of conscience, said in a notice released Oct. 23.

The tribunal also asked that priests be particularly generous throughout November in offering the sacrament of reconciliation and in administering Communion to those who are infirm.

The new provisions were made after a number of bishops asked for guidance as to how the faithful could perform the works required for receiving a plenary indulgence given the ongoing pandemic and restrictions in many parts of the world limiting the number of people who can gather in one place, Cardinal Mauro Piacenza, head of the Apostolic Penitentiary, told Vatican News Oct. 23.

Traditionally, the faithful could receive a full indulgence each day from Nov. 1 to Nov. 8 when they visited a cemetery to pray for the departed and fulfilled other conditions, and, in particular, when they went to a church or an oratory to pray Nov. 2, All Souls' Day.

Bishops' conferences in countries where large numbers of faithful traditionally go to confession, attend Mass and visit cemeteries during the week had asked how the faithful could be accommodated given COVID-19 restrictions or in the case that a member of the faithful was ill, in isolation or in quarantine, the cardinal said.

The Vatican decided to extend the time one can receive a full indulgence to include the whole month of November, he said. Typically, only a partial indulgence is granted after the first week of November.

The full indulgence traditionally offered Nov. 2 for those who visit a church or an oratory and recite the Our Father and the Creed can also be gained any day in November, he added.

Those who cannot leave their homes or residence for "serious reasons," which includes government restrictions during a pandemic, he said, also can receive a plenary indulgence after reciting specific prayers for the deceased or reflecting on a Gospel reading designated for Masses of the dead before an image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary, or by performing a work of mercy.

In all cases, one also must fulfill the normal requirements set by the church for all plenary indulgences, which demonstrate a resolve to turn away from sin and convert to God. Those conditions include: having a spirit detached from sin; going to confession as soon as possible; receiving the Eucharist as soon as possible; praying for the pope's intentions; and being united spiritually with all the faithful.

Cardinal Piacenza said his office also strongly urged all priests to celebrate Mass three times on All Souls' Day, as allowed for in a 1915 document by Pope Benedict XV.

The hope is that the availability of more Masses that day would help everyone wanting to attend Mass to do so while respecting capacity limits in churches and places of worship, he said.

The church teaches that prayer, particularly the Mass, and sacrifices may be offered on behalf of the souls in purgatory. The feast of All Souls differs from the Nov. 1 feast of All Saints precisely because it offers prayers for the eternal peace and heavenly rest of all those who died in a state of grace, but not totally purified.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."


